If there are new rule violation(s), your consultant shall inform you of the violation(s) as soon as possible. However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.



Please refer to the website, <http://www.dec.al.ga.gov/CCS/RulesAndRegulations.aspx>, for information regarding October 1, 2018 rule changes about Criminal Records Checks that may affect your facility. In summary,

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

- 1) Log into DECAL KOALA www.decalkoala.com with the userid for your program
- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute
- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting documentation
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined based on an investigation that, on December 9, 2024, a five-year-old child was standing on the center's bus and not wearing a seat belt when the bus driver hit a curb and slammed on brakes, resulting in the child hitting their mouth on the bus window. The bus driver failed to redirect the child to sit down and use their seat belt.

Health and Hygiene

591-1-1-.07 Children's Health

Not Met

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.07(2) requires that Parents be immediately notified and specific instructions obtained until the child can be picked up or returned to the group, immediately when professional medical attention is required, or when the child experiences symptoms of moderate discomfort, or when the child is involved in an incident that puts their health and/or safety at risk and to notify Parents by the end of the day when professional medical attention is not required, when the child experiences symptoms of less than moderate discomfort or when the child experiences an adverse reaction to prescribed medication which does not constitute moderate discomfort. It was determined based on an investigation that on February 4, 2025, staff failed to immediately notify the parent of a five-year-old child, when the child had been left unattended on the center's vehicle for an undetermined amount of time. The parent was notified the next day.

Policies and Procedures

591-1-1-.29 Required Reporting

Not Met

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.29(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children; and any time the program's operating status changes (i.e., open to closed or temporarily closed and temporarily closed to open). It was determined based on an investigation that on December 9, 2024, the center failed to report to the Department within 24 hours that a five-year-old child sustained an injury to the mouth when the bus driver hit a curb and slammed on brakes. The child was not wearing a seat belt and hit their mouth on the window.

Safety

591-1-1-.36 Transportation(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(10) requires that a child never be left unattended in a vehicle. It was determined based on an investigation that on February 4, 2025, center staff failed to conduct vehicle checks and incorrectly completed the transportation log, resulting in a five-year-old child being left unsupervised on the vehicle for an undetermined amount of time. Professional medical attention was not required.

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(7)(c)2. requires that the driver or other designated person shall immediately document in writing, with a check or other mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist each time a child enters and exits the vehicle. The driver or other designated staff person shall document in writing with a different mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist who was not present on the vehicle for any reason. An explanation shall be documented in writing whenever a child is transported to a field trip site but is not present on the return trip to the Center. It was determined based on an investigation that on February 4, 2025, center staff failed to accurately document children exiting the vehicle on the transportation log as required. The transportation log had been completed, but was not used correctly, when a five-year-old child, who had fallen asleep, was left on the vehicle. The transportation log indicated the child exited the vehicle, but the child remained on the center's vehicle for an undetermined amount of time.

Correction Deadline: 5/22/2025

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(7)(d)1. requires that the first check be conducted immediately upon unloading the last child at any location including, but not limited to, a field trip destination, arrival at the Center, and the last stop during transportation to home or school. The responsible person on the vehicle shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; sign the passenger transportation checklist (s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle; and give the passenger transportation checklist(s) to the second designated Staff person. It was determined based on an investigation that on February 4, 2025, the first check of the center's vehicle was not conducted after children had exited the vehicle after returning to the center. The transportation log was completed to indicate that a first check had been completed but the first check had not been completed, resulting in a five-year-old child in care being left on the vehicle for an undetermined amount of time.

Correction Deadline: 3/20/2025

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.36(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on an investigation that on February 4, 2025, a second check of the center's vehicle was not conducted immediately following the first check as required after the vehicle returned to the center. The transportation log was completed to indicate that a second check had been completed but the second check had not been completed resulting in a five-year-old child being left on the vehicle for an undetermined amount of time.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Investigation

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on an investigation that on February 4, 2025, a five-year-old child was left alone on the center vehicle for an undetermined amount of time, when the vehicle returned to the center. Staff were unaware the child was left on the vehicle until a parent notified center staff that the child was attempting to exit the vehicle.
