- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

- 1) Log into DECAL KOALA www.decalkoala.com with the userid for your program
- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute
- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting documentation
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that there was lifting along the bottom of the back fence (right bottom side).

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined, based on observation, that a visible protruding screw/bolt extending more than two threads and chipping paint were present on the slide on Playground A (Left Side); chipping paint was present throughout several areas of the large play equipment on Playground B (Rear); and chipping paint was present throughout several areas of the large play equipment and on the bench on Playground C (Right Side).

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Correction Deadline: 2/21/2026

Finding

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation mulch under the large equipment and throughout the play area measuring at 2 inches instead of the required 6 inches and on Playground A: Left Side, mulch under the large equipment and throughout the play area measuring at 2 inches instead of the required 6 inches on Playground B: Rear; and mulch under the large equipment and throughout the play area measuring at 1 inch instead of the required 6 inches on Playground C: Right Side.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily, adding resilient surfacing as needed to maintain adequate resiliency.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(a) requires an annual safety check for each vehicle. The annual safety check, completed by a trained individual, should include a check of the: tires, headlights, horn, taillights, turn signals, brake lights, brakes, suspension, exhaust system, steering, windows, windshields and windshield wipers. A copy of the annual safety check will be kept in the Center or on the vehicle and should include evidence of any repairs and/or replacements that were identified as needed on the inspection report. It was determined based on review of documentation transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3791 had an Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection that indicated deficient items such as issues with the brake lights, brakes, as well as the heating system, transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3792 had an Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection that indicated deficient items such as headlights, steering, windshield wipers, as well as a dry oil stick; and transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3793 had an Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection that indicated deficient items such as tires and brakes.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will obtain the annual vehicle inspection.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(b) requires that the interior of a transportation vehicle be clean, in safe repair and free of hazardous items, objects and/or other non-essential items which could cause injury. It was determined based on observation that transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3791 a missing seat belt tongue to connect to the buckle for safety in the middle seat of row one, ripped seating exposing foam covered with tape throughout the van; and damaged flooring, transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3792 had ripped seating exposing foam covered with tape throughout the van, as well as damaged flooring; and transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3793 had ripped seating exposing foam covered with tape throughout the van; and damaged flooring. All three transportation vehicles had some trash and/or paper on the floor and seats.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

- The center will maintain that all transportation vehicles are clean, in safe repair, and free from hazards.
- The center will ensure that all deficient items indicated on the Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection for each transportation vehicle are corrected.
