- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding

591-1-1-.25(7) requires that doors to rooms not approved for child care, other than the kitchen doors, be latched or locked so children cannot wander into those areas. Except in School-age Centers, interior Center door locks shall permit Personnel to open the locked room from outside of the room in an emergency. It was determined based on observation that the infant room barrier was not long enough and allowed a child access to the hallway. Also The barrier for the 3-year old classroom was not four feet and a door was missing from an additional opening in the room that also gave children access to the hallway.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will lift the barrier to 4 foot or higher as well as add a door to the other opening to secure the children from having access to the hallway. The center will also complete the barrier in the infant and 1-year old classroom to ensure the children don't have access to the hallway.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)**Not Met****Finding**

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the fence on the left side of the playground was not secure and made out of bamboo. Also there were several panels on all sides of the fence that were detached and needed fixed or replacing.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and repair the panels that needed fixing and replacing the left side of the fence closest to the 3-year old classroom.

Correction Deadline: 4/16/2026**Finding**

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation that the resilient surfacing was 3 inches when 6 inches were required. Also the fall zones were 9 feet in the back and 12 feet in the front when 14 feet were required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily, adding resilient surfacing as needed to maintain adequate resiliency.

Correction Deadline: 3/5/2026**Finding**

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the stairs and the bottom of the stairs were concrete and covered with turf and needed appropriate layering. Also there were two stumps that were exposed and accessible to the children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will layer or cover the concrete, spray paint the two stumps and remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground.

Correction Deadline: 4/16/2026**Food Service****591-1-1-.18 Kitchen Operations****Met****Comment**

Kitchen appears clean and well organized on this date. The provider will not prepare meals but parents will provide all meals and the provider will have snacks. It was explained to the provider that they may use paper products only because of a two sink compartment. Provider did not have a refrigerator but advised it was ordered and shipped.

Health and Hygiene**591-1-1-.10 Diapering Areas & Practices(CR)****Met****Comment**

Staff stated proper procedures. Sinks with warm running water observed adjacent to proper diapering surfaces in all classrooms approved for diapering.

591-1-1-.17 Hygiene(CR)**Met****Comment**

There were no children enrolled on this date. Proper hand washing of children and staff was discussed with the director on this date.

The Provider currently does not dispense/administer medication. Proper of administration and documentation was discussed with the provider on this date.

There were no children enrolled on this date. The center's discipline policy was reviewed on this date. Regulations regarding proper discipline were discussed with the director on this date.
