The purpose of today's visit was to conduct a licensing study. The provider stated that they do not dispense medication, take field trips, or provide swimming activities.

- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

(O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

591-1-1-.08(1) requires the Center Staff to maintain a file for each child while such child is in care and for one year after that child is no longer enrolled. In order for the file to be complete, the file shall contain the following: child's name, birth date, sex, address, living arrangement, name of school if applicable; names of both Parents, home and work addresses, and home and work telephone numbers; name(s) and addresses of the person(s) to whom the child may be released including address, telephone numbers, relationship to child and to Parent(s), and other identifying information; name(s) and telephone number(s) of person(s) to contact in emergencies when the Parent cannot be reached; name and telephone number of the child's primary source of health care; and a statement regarding known allergies, physical problems, mental health disorders, intellectual disabilities or developmental disabilities which limit the child's participation in the program. It was determined based on a review of children's enrollment records that Child # 1 was missing physician phone number, Child # 3 was missing parent work numbers and allergy/medical information, and Child #5 was missing allergy/medical information.

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the bathroom in classroom A had Lysol sitting next to the sink, and the counter top in classroom D had Lysol and a bottle of hand sanitizer within reach of children. It was further determined that in Main Room A, a thin electrical wire for lighting was dangling over the edge of one infant's crib that was not occupied at the time of observation.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on observation that the back left portion of the blue wall in classroom A had several damaged sections of drywall. Additionally, there was a large bag of trash sitting in the back of classroom D and was accessible to the children.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that electrical outlets in classroom A and classroom D did not have protective caps and were within children's reach.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)**Not Met****Finding**

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that on the left playground in the back left corner, the fence had a gap that measured 1 inch wide to 7 inches wide from top to bottom. That same part of the fence had protruding screws that posed a hazard to children.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed:

-Two of two red and black tricycles were rusting and missing pedals.

-The blue tricycle was missing the back right wheel and both pedals.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed to be present on the playground:

-The exterior door to the after school room had splintered wood along the door frame and exposed foam underneath.

-On the playground to the left, exposed rebar underneath the green and yellow structure with a blue slide posed a tripping hazard and had sharp edges.

-On the playground to the left, there was exposed landscape fabric underneath the blue ABC play structure that posed a tripping hazard.

-Trash that included styrofoam cups, food wrappers, and paper towels.

-AC unit gate latch was not secured.

-The silver horse play structure had exposed concrete underneath.

-On the playground to the left in the back right corner there was exposed concrete that had sharp edges and posed a tripping hazard.

-On the playground to the left there was a large section of PVC pipe along the base of the building with sharp edges on the end.

591-1-1-.16(f) requires the Center to submit an application for an amended License at least 30 days prior to a change if there is a change in the name of the program or Center, changes in the ages of the children to be served, an increase in the regular hours of operation such that the Center would be providing evening or night-time care in addition to day-time care, changes in the services provided, or additions to or changes in the use of the building by the licensed Center. If an emergency situation arises which makes it impossible to give thirty (30) days' notice, the management of the Center shall notify the Department by telephone and shall submit an application for an amended License as soon as management becomes aware of the change that will be necessitated by the emergency situation. In no case, however, shall a new owner operate the Center without first securing a new License or Permit from the Department. It was determined based on observation that a wall had been built to divide classroom D into two rooms. The ages of the children served in that room was changed to add one year olds and create a diapered classroom with no amendment submitted for the changes to the classroom.

It was determined based on observation that the van used for transportation with tag number TES9490 had a broken seat belt latch on the front row of seats. Additionally, both vans used for transportation had several seats that had ripped leather with exposed foam.

591-1-1-.36(6) requires written Parental authorization for routine transportation provided by or on behalf of the Center. Written authorization must include the routine pick-up location, routine pick-up time, routine delivery location, routine delivery times and the name of any person authorized to receive the child. It was determined based on a review of transportation records the six children were transported between the dates of March 10, 2025 and March 24, 2025 in the afternoons with no parental authorization provided. Two children were transported from Coastal Plains to the daycare, one was transported from Scintilla Charter Academy to the daycare, one was transported from Pinevale to the daycare, and two were transported from Sallas Mahone to the daycare.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(7)(b) requires that an emergency medical information record be maintained in the vehicle for each child being transported. The emergency medical information record for each child shall include a listing of the child's full name, date of birth, allergies, special medical needs and conditions, current prescribed medications that the child is required to take on a daily basis for a chronic condition, the name and telephone number of the child's doctor, the local medical facility that the Center uses in the area where the Center is located and the telephone numbers where the Parents can be reached. It was determined based on a review of transportation records that six children were transported between the dates of March 10, 2025 and March 24, 2025 in the afternoons with no emergency medical information provided. Two children were transported from Coastal Plains to the daycare, one was transported from Scintilla Charter Academy to the daycare, one was transported from Pinevale to the daycare, and two were transported from Sallas Mahone to the daycare.

When such storage is not available for the cots and mats, each child's bedding shall be kept separate from other children's bedding and stored in containers marked for individual use, such as, but not limited to, bins, cubbies, or bags. It was determined based on observation that 14 cots in classroom A, 12 cots in classroom B, and 21 cots in classroom C were not properly stored with appropriate coverings to prevent children's access to them.

It was determined based on review of records that staff #1 was hired on 11/04/2024, has no satisfactory Comprehensive Criminal Records Determination letter on file, and has not submitted both a Records Check Application to the Department and Fingerprints to an authorized fingerprinting site.

The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. It was determined based on observation and review of records that staff #1 was hired on 11/04/2024 and currently has no satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination letter on file as required.

Finding

591-1-1-.14(1) requires the Center Director and, at any given time, at least fifty percent (50%) of the caregiver Staff to successfully complete a biennial training program in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and a triennial training program in first aid. The first aid training must be done by certified or licensed health care professionals or trainers and must deal with the provision of emergency care to infants and children. The Center shall maintain current evidence of the successful completion of such training which shall be available to the Department for inspection. It was determined based on review of records that less than 50% of staff did not have up to date first aid and CPR training on file.

591-1-1-.14(1)(a) requires, in a Center that provides transportation, that either the driver or another Staff person present on the vehicle have current evidence of successful completion of a biennial training program in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and a triennial training program in first aid offered by certified or licensed health care professionals or trainers and which dealt with the provision of emergency care to infants and children. It was determined based on review of records that both transportation drivers did not have current first aid and CPR training on file.

The first aid kit, together with a first aid instruction manual which must be kept with the kit at all times, shall be stored so that it is not accessible to children but is easily accessible to Staff. It was determined that both vans used for transportation did not have the required first aid kits.
