- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

It was determined based on observation that a Staff person in classroom F-1st Right 1 & 2 years was observed to pick children up by one arm as the staff person removed the children from the children from climbing down from the stool on this date.

Classroom E 2nd Right:

- A bottle of sanitizer was observed hanging on a bookbag in the cubbies accessible to children in care.
- A staff bag was observed on top of the cabinet on the left side of the classroom accessible to children in care.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined that the interior fence on the left side of Playground B had missing wooden planks that created two gaps that measured nine and a half inches on the front left side and the fencing near the concrete. It was also determined that the interior fence on the back left side of Playground B had a disconnected wooden plank and a protruding nail. It was further determined that there were two exposed nails on the front left interior fencing that were accessible to children in care.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed:

Playground A:

- A broken seat was observed on the blue and green spring seesaw.
- Rust was observed on the chair legs near classroom F 1st Rights window.
- Rust was observed inside of the green tunnel.
- Black residue was observed on the handle bars of the red tricycle.

Playground B:

- An exposed screw was observed on the orange car.
 - Rust was observed on the chair legs.
 - Exposed bolts were observed on the red/green/blue toy equipment under the gazebo.
 - Exposed screws were observed on the bottom of the chalk board easel.
 - Rust was observed on the steering wheel and seat of the red car.
 - Chipping paint was observed on the orange car structure.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(7) requires that climbing and swinging equipment be anchored. It was determined based on observation that the blue and green spring seesaw was not anchored on Playground A.

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed:

Playground A:

- Weeds were observed growing through the air conditioner unit fencing.
- Exposed zip ties were observed near the entrance playground door attached to the fence around the air conditioner unit.
- Weeds were observed growing through the perimeter fence on the right side.

Playground B:

- A active ant pile was observed on the left side of the hill near the wooden fencing accessible to children in care.
 - Weeds were observed growing throughout the perimeter fencing.

591-1-1-.30(1)(a) requires a crib that is safety approved in compliance with Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and American Society of Testing and Materials International (ASTM) safety standards be provided for each infant. It was determined based on observation that the crib in classroom F-1st Right did not meet CPSC and ASTM safety standards on this date. The crib was observed to be manufactured on March 31, 2003.

591-1-1-.14(1)(a) requires all Staff who provide direct care to children must obtain certification in a biennial training program in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and a triennial training program in pediatric first aid within the first 45 days of employment. Current and valid evidence of the successful completion of such training shall be maintained on the Center's premises. The hours obtained completing this certification will not count towards the required annual training hours. It was determined based on a review of records that Staff # 8 hired on December 21, 2025, did not obtain certification in a biennial training program in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and a triennial training program in pediatric first aid within the first 45 days of employment.

Finding

591-1-1-.14(2)(b) requires that there must always be one staff person present in each classroom where children are present that has current and valid pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and pediatric first aid training. It was determined based on observation that Staff # 8 hired on December 21, 2025, was observed in classroom F-1st Right alone during naptime without a current or valid certification in a biennial training program in pediatric cardiopulmonary resuscitation and a triennial training program in pediatric first aid.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Staff:Child Ratios and Group Size(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.32(2) requires the Center maintain Staff:child ratios in mixed-age groups based on the age of the youngest group of children that includes more than twenty percent of the total number of children in the mixed-age group. It was determined based on observation that a ratio of 1:16 consisting of nine 3-year-old children and 7 2-year-old children were observed on Playground A, as the other Staff person was observed assisting a child inside classroom E-2nd Right.

Finding

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on observation that the a Staff person was observed to walk out of classroom B 2nd Left 3 & 4 years for one minute leaving 11 children in classroom B unsupervised.
