- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute
- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting documentation
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed accessible to children on this date:

K-4:

- A metal tin was located in a child's bookbag that contained three packs of Welly Instant Hand Sanitize, and one pack of Welly Triple Antibiotic First Aid Ointment.
- A pack of Goofy Foot Designs Spray Chalk was located on the counter.

T-1A:

- There were several gloves in a container by the diaper changing table.

T-2A;

- There were several gloves on the changing table near the door to the restroom.

T-1B:

- There were several gloves in a container by the diaper changing table.

T-2B:

- There was a container of Comforts 100% Pure Petroleum Jelly in a child's bookbag.
- There were gloves and baby wipes by the bathroom door.

T-3A:

- There was a pack of CVS Health Ultra-Soft cleansing wipes, a pack of Parent's Choice baby wipes, and a pack of Tencel baby wipes on a low shelf containing children's toys.

T-3B:

- The storage closet door lock was broken on this date causing the door to not lock appropriately. The storage closet contained a jug of Zep Neutral pH Floor Cleaner on the floor.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined that the following playground equipment hazards were accessible on this date:

Left Playground:

- There were four out of four swings with rusted hardware.
- There were eight out of eight swing chain covers that were cracked and peeling.
- The spindles and railing on the fort had peeling paint.
- There was a 4.5 inch gap between two spindles on the fort.
- The bottom platform on the green and beige climber equipment had a section of coating peeling with exposed rust.
- The red tricycles had handles that were dirty and needed to be cleaned.

Right Playground:

- The tricycles were rusted.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters. The Consultants and Director further discussed ensuring that as playground equipment paint begins to peel the equipment is sanded to reduce rust and repainted.

It was determined based on observation that five out of nineteen crib sheets were too tight fitting on this date causing the crib mattress to bow upward. One of the five cribs were in use during the visit.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that each crib has an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant.

It was determined based on a review of records that Staff #17, hired on August 1, 2011, did not have a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file after the most recent satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination had expired on May 18, 2026

IMMEDIATE CORRECTION - The Center will watch the videos] to ensure that every Employee has a valid and current satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file prior to being present at the Center while any child is present for care or before an individual age 17 or older resides in the Center. The Comprehensive Records Check Determination must have a Records Check Clearance Date that is no older than the preceding 12 months of the hire date; provided, however, if the Employee has had a lapse of employment from the child care industry that lasted for 180 days (6 months) or longer, a new satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination is required. The program's owner or an officer/member of the corporation must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date. The center will watch the videos to ensure the CRC rules are maintained.

It was determined based on a review of records that Staff #17, hired on August 1, 2011, did not immediately obtained a new Comprehensive Records Check Determination every five years when the most recent Comprehensive Records Check Determination letter had expired on May 18, 2026.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

IMMEDIATE CORRECTION - The Center will watch the videos to ensure that each Director, Employee and Provisional Employee has a Comprehensive Records Check Determination on file that has been issued within the past five years. The program's owner or an officer/member of the corporation must view the A to Z Background Check video units pertaining to this records check rule and return the signed affidavit within one week from this visit date. The Center will watch the videos to ensure CRC rules are maintained.

It was determined based on a review of records that Staff #39, hired on February 16, 2026, did not have pediatric first aid and CPR training on this date as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

All caregiver Staff must successfully complete a biennial training program in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and a triennial training program in first aid taught by certified or licensed health care professionals or trainers and must deal with the provision of emergency care to infants and children. The Director will send copies via email of verification of completed CPR/First Aid certification to the Consultant upon completion.
