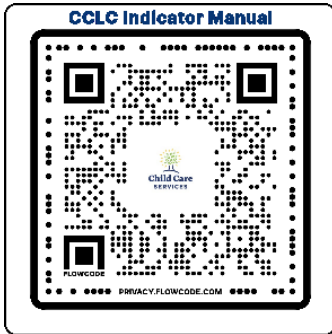

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

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Summary Report

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591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were accessible to children:

- Main Playground A: Left Side - There were inward facing protruding screw/bolt that measured over two threads on the gate that connected to Main Playground B: Rear. There were gap spacing that exceeded 3.5 inches on the white fencing that secured hazardous equipment.
- Main Playground B: Rear- There was lifting along the bottom of the fence (right bottom side of playground) that left a gap of up to 6 inches high and was 12 feet and 8 inches long.
- Main Playground C: Left- There were inward facing protruding screw/bolt that measured over two threads on the gate that connected to Main Playground B: Rear. In addition, there was a 4 inch gap in the gate that connected to Main Playground B: Rear. There was lifting along the bottom of the fence in the back of the playground that left a gap of up to 5 inches high. There was a 5 inch gap at the bottom of the fence in the front left corner that faced the parking lot. Additionally, there was a 4 inch gap at the bottom of the wooden fence at the front of the playground that secured hazards.

Correction Deadline: 4/6/2026

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were accessible to children:

-Main Playground A: Left Side - There were chipping paint on the slide and a broken plastic step on the play structure.

-Main Playground B: Rear- There were chipping paint throughout several areas of the large play structure.

-Main Playground C: Right Side- There were chipping paint throughout several areas of the large play equipment as well as chipping paint on the green bench.

Correction Deadline: 4/9/2026

Finding

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on observation mulch under the large equipment and throughout the play area measured at 2 inches instead of the required 6 inches on the Main Playground B; Rear. Mulch under the large equipment and throughout the play area measured at less than 1 inch instead of the required 6 inches on Main Playground C: Right Side.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were accessible to children:

-Main Playground B: Rear- There was a section of lifted turf behind the play structure that posed a tripping hazard.

591-1-1-.36 Transportation(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(a) requires an annual safety check for each vehicle. The annual safety check, completed by a trained individual, should include a check of the: tires, headlights, horn, taillights, turn signals, brake lights, brakes, suspension, exhaust system, steering, windows, windshields and windshield wipers. A copy of the annual safety check will be kept in the Center or on the vehicle and should include evidence of any repairs and/or replacements that were identified as needed on the inspection report. It was determined based on a review of records that transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3791 crossed out and tag number SNE2431 written in had an Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection that indicated deficient items such as issues with the brake lights, brakes, and heating system. Transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3792 crossed out and tag number SNE2430 written in had an Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection that indicated deficient items such as headlights, steering, windshield wipers, and a dry oil stick. Transportation vehicle with the tag number RIQ3793 crossed out and tag number SNE2429 written in had an Annual Vehicle Safety Inspection that indicated deficient items such as tires and brakes.

Correction Deadline: 4/4/2026

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(b) requires that the interior of a transportation vehicle be clean, in safe repair and free of hazardous items, objects and/or other non-essential items which could cause injury. It was determined based on observation that transportation vehicle with the tag number SNE2431 written in had a missing seat belt tongue to connect to the buckle for safety in the middle seat of row one, ripped seating with exposed foam covered with tape throughout the van, and damaged flooring. Transportation vehicle with the tag number SNE2430 had ripped seating with exposed foam covered with tape that was rolling up, and damaged flooring. Transportation vehicle with the tag number SNE2429 had ripped seating with exposed foam covered with tape throughout the van and damaged flooring. All three transportation vehicles had litter throughout the interior of the vehicles.

Staffing and Supervision

Finding

591-1-1-.32(4) requires that children under three years old be housed in separate physical areas from older children and cannot be mixed with older children except at specified times and circumstances. It was determined based on observation that there was a ratio of 2:16 present in the Main C: (3L) Little Three's classroom. The group consisted of three 2-year-old and thirteen 3-year-old children. None of the children had a written agreement from the parent on file at the center for the group to be housed together.

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on observation that an 11-year-old child was alone and unsupervised in the Main G: (3R) Big Dawgs classroom. The child was seated on a sofa and watching a tablet. Center staff stated that the 11-year-old child was a staff member's child who was sick. Additionally, school-aged children entered the Center from Center vehicles and the County school bus in the afternoon and walked down the hallway to Main G: (3R) Big Dawgs classroom without supervision.

Correction Deadline: 3/30/2026
