- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Refutation Process:

You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute
- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting documentation
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

Child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the CAPS/ QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward an initial star rating. Provisional Status eligibility will be determined at the time of CAPS enrollment as part of the CAPS application process.

It was determined based on observation that in Room B-#1-2L-3's there were two large cubbies near the cots that were unstable and posed a tipping hazard.

Room A-#2-1L-3's

- A grocery bag sitting on top of the shelf in the Art area.
- A broom and dustpan in the back left corner of the room.
- The plastic packaging for disposable cups on top of the cubby.
- One box of vinyl gloves and one pack of baby wipes labeled, "keep out of reach of children" on top of the black and clear storage drawer tower.

Room B-#1-2L-3's

- One box of vinyl gloves on top of the cubby.

Room G-Back Wing-#9-1L-1's & 2's

- Inside a low shelf were two boxes of polyethylene disposable gloves, two packs of baby wipes labeled "keep out of reach of children", and one box of vinyl gloves.
- The plastic packaging to disposable plates on top of the purple and clear storage drawer tower.

Room H-Back Wing-#8-1R-1's & 2's

- One pack of baby wipes labeled, "keep out of reach of children" on top of the refrigerator in the Dramatic Play area.

Room I-Back Wing-#7-2R-1's & 2's

- One pack of baby wipes labeled, "keep out of reach of children" on top of the changing table.
- A roll of white trash bags on top of a shelf near the changing table.
- Three boxes of vinyl gloves and two packages of baby wipes labeled, "keep out of reach of children" on top of the cubby.

The children's bathroom across from the front office had a roll of trash bags on the blue and clear storage drawer tower.

- One pack of baby wipes labeled, "keep out of reach of children" on a yellow chair.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(8) requires protective caps on all unused electrical outlets within children's reach and requires that electrical outlets in use be made inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that in Room C-#3-4L-3's the electric outlet on the left side of the computer desk, the electrical outlet on the back wall near the computer desk, and the electrical outlet in the Block area were without protective caps and posed an electric shock hazard.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to check outlets and replace protective caps when needed and identify and monitor how outlets in use are inaccessible to children.

It was determined based on a review of records that the bus with license number EPV789 did not document the loaded or unloaded time for the week of April 14, 2025, through April 18, 2025, as required.

The Center will ensure that each date and time of arrival and departure is documented by the driver or designated person with training, review and monitoring.

91-1-1-.33(5) requires that every calendar year after the first year of employment, all supervisory and caregiver Personnel, except independent contractors, Students-in-Training and volunteers shall attend ten (10) clock hours of diverse training which is task-focused in on-going health, safety and early childhood or child development related topics and which is offered by an accredited college, university or vocational program or other Department-approved source. The annual ten (10) clock hours of training shall be chosen from the following fields: child development, including discipline, guidance, nutrition, injury control and safety; health, including sanitation, disease control, cleanliness, detection and disposition of illness; child abuse and neglect, including identification and reporting, and meeting the needs of abused and/or neglected children; and business related topics, including parental communication, recordkeeping, etc.; provided however that such business related training shall be limited to no more than two (2) of the required ten (10) clock hours of training. Records of completion of such training shall be maintained, as required by these rules. It was determined based on a review of records that staff member #15 did not have evidence of 10 hours of annual training for the year 2024 as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will plan and schedule the required 10 hours of annual training each year and follow up to ensure the training is completed.
