- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

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Summary Report

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.26(8) requires climbing and swinging equipment to have a resilient surface beneath the equipment and the fall zone from such equipment must be adequately maintained by the Center to assure continuing resiliency. It was determined based on an investigation that on January 23, 2023, a four-year-old child flipped out of a swing causing the child to fall to the ground. A measurement of the mulch revealed that there was approximately four and a half inches of mulch on the preschool playground when at least six inches of mulch was required. Due to the inadequate resilient surface beneath the swing, the resilient surface was unable to provide a buffer and prevent an injury when the child fell from the equipment.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will add additional resilient surfacing to the fall zones where needed and check daily, adding resilient surfacing as needed to maintain adequate resiliency.
