Further, from time to time the department discovers additional rule violations during the course of an investigation. If there are new rule violation(s), your consultant shall inform you of the violation(s) as soon as possible. However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined based on investigative findings, which included staff statements and interviews, parent interview, and video footage, this allegation was substantiated. There was enough evidence to support that on June 14, 2023, center staff failed to do a proper transition activity in the one-year-old classroom that cause a one-year-old child to sustain nursemaid's elbow. Staff statement revealed that the child was walking to the changing table and stumbled while still holding the staff's hand. Staff statements further revealed that the child tripped over their own feet. Furthermore, staff statements revealed that on June 14, 2023, the child was observed favoring their right arm after getting off the changing table. The parent indicated that they did receive a call from the center. The parent indicated that the child was taken to the Emergency Room to get the right arm reset and the child ended up with a cast. On June 20, 2023, the consultant reviewed the video footage that which revealed the staff did not let go of the child's right hand when the child stumbled towards the changing table. The video footage further revealed that the staff pulled the child's right arm up before picking the child up to place the child on the changing table. The child did receive professional medical attention for the incident.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will review requirements with Staff to ensure that appropriate activities are conducted with children.
