- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. 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Summary Report

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.15(9) requires that a written statement be on file from a medical authority when a child requires a modified diet for medical reasons and from the child's Parent(s) when a child requires a modified diet for religious reasons. All caregiver Personnel shall be informed of the diet restriction for the child and only food that complies with the prescribed dietary regimen but still meets the food and nutrition requirements shall be served to the child. It was determined based on an investigation and through a review of records, that on June 10, 2022, the center served a four-year-old child with a known allergy to tree nuts a food product containing tree nut oil. Additionally, the center failed to ensure that a written statement was on file from a medical authority for a four-year-old child that required a modified diet for medical reasons. Staff interviews and a review of records confirmed that the center obtained medical authority after the four-year-old child sustained hives and vomiting after ingesting food containing ingredients associated with the child's diet restrictions. Professional medical attention was obtained.
