However, as stated above, any violations of identical rule(s) will require the department to treat any and all additional rule violations identified in the investigation as repeated rule violations.

All rule violations found in relation to a complaint or incident investigation will be associated with the date the investigation was closed.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on staff statements and center video that on May 26, 2022, a tree limb fell on the playground while children were present, however staff statements further revealed that staff did not have previous knowledge that the tree would fall. After review of the center video, it revealed that a tree limb fell on the playground while children were present. Center video further revealed that there were no children injured.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Food Service

591-1-1-.15 Food Service & Nutrition

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.15(2)(a) requires Center Personnel to hold and feed infants less than six months of age and older children who cannot hold their own bottles or sit alone. Baby bottles shall never be propped; the infant's head shall be elevated while feeding. It was determined based on staff statements, that staff members have propped bottles briefly for infants when they are attending to other children.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to hold infants less than six months old or who can not hold their own bottle, to never prop bottles and to elevate infant's heads during feeding. The director will monitor Staff to ensure appropriate feeding procedures are followed.

Staff Records

591-1-1-.28 Prohibited Substances

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.28(2) prohibits smoking on the premises of the Center during the hours of operation and in any vehicle used to transport children during the hours the Center is in operation. It was determined that a staff person was observed vaping on the playground with children present on an undetermined date. Staff interviews also revealed that the staff was no longer employed at the center.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will instruct Staff regarding the smoking ban and will notify anyone who may be on the Center premises that smoking is prohibited. The Center will monitor.
