- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important New Deadlines:

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

Activities and Equipment

591-1-1-.03 Activities **Not Met**

Finding

591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury.

It was determined based on investigative findings that staff in the infant room conducted rectal temperature checks to monitor potential COVID symptoms without specific health training in this procedure and used the thermometer in a way that could potentially cause injury to the infant.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will review requirements with Staff to ensure that appropriate activities are conducted with children.

Health and Hygiene

591-1-1-.07 Children's Health

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.07(1) requires Center Staff to not accept a child nor allow a child to remain at the Center if the child has the equivalent of a 101 degrees Fahrenheit or higher oral temperature and another contagious symptom, such as but not limited to, a rash, diarrhea or a sore throat. When a child shows symptoms of illness during the day, the child shall be moved to a quiet area away from other children where the child shall be supervised and provided the necessary attention until such time as the child leaves the Center or is able to return to the child's

It was determined based on investigative findings that infants in the infant room were given rectal temperature checks instead of oral or temporal temperature checks at least twice a day to monitor potential COVID symptoms. Staff had not obtained specific health training in this procedure.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center director will make Center Staff and parents/guardians aware of this requirement and will not allow children with the listed symptoms to attend or remain in the Center while ill. Center Staff will identify a quiet area for ill children and develop a plan for supervision.

591-1-1-.17 Hygiene(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.17(2) requires that Personnel, to the extent possible, keep children clean, dry and comfortable. It was determined based on investigative findings that staff in the infant room conducted rectal temperature checks to monitor potential COVID symptoms without specific health training in this procedure and did not use lubricant nor probe covers between each use.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train staff, review regularly, and monitor.

591-1-1-.20 Medications(CR)

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.20(1) requires Personnel to obtain specific written authorization from the child's physician or parent in order to dispense prescription or non-prescription medications, except for first aid. Such authorization will include when applicable, date; full name of the child; name of the medication; prescription number, if any; dosage; the dates to be given; the time of day to be dispensed; and signature of parent. It was determined based on investigative findings that 'Desitin' diaper ointment was used during diaper changes without evidence of parental permission.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff to obtain and review parental authorizations to ensure the authorization contains complete information. The designated person(s) will monitor daily.

591-1-1-.21 Operational Policies & Procedures

Not Met

Finding

591-1-1-.21(4) requires the Center to provide to Parents a copy of the Center's written policies and procedures. It was determined based on investigative findings that the center did not provide a copy of the policies and procedures upon enrollment of child on August 2, 2021..

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will make giving parents a copy of the policies and procedures a routine step in the enrollment process and will train Staff who participate in the enrollment process. The Center will ensure sufficient copies are available.
