- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Room A 1st left

- Broom, dust pan, and vacuum accessible.
- Toilet brush cleaner and plunger accessible.

Room I 3rd right

- Teacher purse in blue chair accessible to children.
- Diaper wipes in children's bags.

Room E- Middle 3rd right

- Broom and dust pan in second bathroom.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(17) requires that the Center premises be free of plants and shrubs which are poisonous or hazardous. It was determined based on observation the following hazards were observed:

Playground D-Toddler area

- Throny plants/vines growing through the fence.
- Vines/plants growing back left behind bucket swings.
- Vines growing on the fence on the left side.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The harmful item will be removed.

591-1-1-.26(4) - 591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation that there was a three inch gap in the back left side behind the gazebo.

Technical Assistance

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed:

Playground C- soccer/water area

- Red tricycle missing cap on right side of handlebar.
- Yellow tricycle missing both caps on handlebars and missing a pedal.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation the following hazards were observed

All playgrounds

- Tarp exposed throughout playground.
- Pine cones accessible

Playground A

- Tire swing netting.
- Exposed concrete on front left post and back left post
- Three of four swing seats not in good repair. The rubber is ripped off seats.

Playground B- Basketball court

- Vines growing on the fence on the left side.

Playground C- soccer/water area

- High grass.
- Red tricycle missing cap on right side of handle bar.
- Yellow tricycle missing both caps on handle bars and missing a pedal.

Playground D-Toddler area

- Throny plants/vines growing through the fence.
- Vines/plants growing back left behind bucket swings.

Playground infant area

- Exposed concrete on the right post on the entrance of the playground.
- Fence gate was not closed.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Foods that are associated with young children's choking incidents, such as, but not limited to, peanuts, hot dogs, raw carrots, popcorn, fish with bones, cheese cubes, grapes and any other food that is of similar shape and size of the trachea/windpipe shall not be served to the children less than four (4) years of age. Children older than four (4) years of age may be served these foods provided that the foods are cut in such a way as to minimize choking. Food shall not be accessible or served to children until it has been chopped, diced, cut or mashed and is appropriate for each child's age and individual eating, chewing and swallowing ability.

- Pacifier attached to clothing.
- Infant had a bib around neck.

591-1-1-.10(4) - 591-1-1-.10(4) requires that if diapers are changed on a diaper changing surface, the surface shall be smooth, nonporous, and equipped with a guard or rails to prevent falls. Between each diaper change, the diaper changing surface shall be cleaned with a disinfectant and dried with a single-use disposable towel. It was determined based on observation the diapering pad had a tear in the right back section.

591-1-1-.30(2)(c) requires that infants shall not sleep in equipment other than safety-approved cribs, such as, but not limited to, a car safety seat, bouncy seat, highchair, or swing. Infants who arrive at the Center asleep or fall asleep in such equipment, on the floor or elsewhere, shall be transferred to a safety-approved crib. It was determined based on observation an infant was asleep in the bouncy chair.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will only place infants in safe cribs to sleep and will transfer them to a safe crib when the infants are asleep in other equipment.
