An on-site inspection was conducted on April 12, 2022 with the Provider Cheryl Neal. An Administrative Review was conducted on April 20, 2022. Staff files, children's files, training, and background checks were all reviewed.

- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding

290-2-3-.09(5) requires that children less than three (3) years of age shall not spend more than one-half (1/2) hour of time consecutively in confining equipment, such as swings, highchairs, jumpseats, carriers or walkers. Children shall use such equipment only when they are awake. Such children shall be allowed time to play on the floor daily. It was determined based on observation that three one-year-old children were confined to their beds for more than thirty minutes.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will ensure that children less three years of age do not spend more than 1/2 an hour in confining equipment and shall be allowed floor time daily.

Finding

290-2-3-.12(5) requires all indoor and outdoor furniture, activity materials, and equipment shall be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint and kept clean. It was determined based on observation that the playground equipment including the white car, white and orange car, small blue slide, white and black jeep, and orange/yellow/blue play equipment was not kept clean as required as it was covered in black residue. It was further determined that additional playground hazards existed in that the following was observed:

- Rust on yellow climber.
- Discarded playground equipment (bus and ball hoop).
- Rust and chipping paint on Spring-go-round.
- Chipped and peeling paint on red/blue playhouse.
- rust and chipped peeling paint on red tunnel.
- Rust and chipped peeling paint on yellow bus.
- Rust on rail next to AC.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will repair or replace any identified hazardous or unclean equipment and will monitor all indoor and outdoor equipment to ensure it is free from hazards and kept clean.

It was determined based on observation that cleaning solutions and hand soap were stored in an unlocked cabinet under the sink in the bathroom. It was further determined based on observation that plastic grocery bags were on the floor next to the changing table and the vacuum, broom and plastic bags were in the corner next to the door.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

To ensure the safe storage of hazardous items, the Home Provider will make these items inaccessible to the children.

Finding

290-2-3-.13(2)(a) requires that outdoor play areas be kept clean and free of hazards such as exposed sharp corners of concrete or equipment, rust and splinters on equipment, broken glass, open drainage ditches, holes and stagnant water. It was determined based on observation that the outside area hazards include, the following:

- Garden tools/equipment and lawn maintenance items (lawn mowers, wheelbarrow, shovel, ladder, dolly cart).
- Eight 55 gallon trash cans of stagnant water.
- Wood pieces on top of the animal cage and next to the right side of the fence.
- Exposed tarp next to red/yellow picnic table.
- Water hose accessible under gazebo.
- Broken concrete pieces under gazebo inside the trench.
- There was a shovel inside of the large yellow slide.
- Splintered, deteriorated wood around mulch.
- Large yellow slide with shovel accessible.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will repair any and all identified outdoor hazards and will monitor playground daily or more often as needed to ensure that the Home's outdoor play area is kept clean and free of hazards.

Finding

290-2-3-.10(3)(a) requires Staff to hold and feed infants less than six (6) months of age and older children who cannot hold their own bottles or sit alone. Baby bottles shall never be propped; the infant's head shall be elevated while feeding. It was determined based on observation that the Provider feed a four-month-old infant while in a bouncy chair instead of holding the infant as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Staff shall hold infants less than six months old or who can not hold their own bottle, to never prop bottles and to elevate infant's heads during feeding. The Provider will monitor to ensure appropriate feeding procedures are followed.

290-2-3-.07(17) requires at least one Staff person with a satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination shall supervise Children at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means Staff members are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The person(s) supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. Plans shall be made to obtain additional Staff help in cases of emergencies. It was determined based on observation that a four-year-old child walked out of the room and up stairs without adult supervision.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will ensure that either the Provider or at least one Staff person with a satisfactory Comprehensive Records Check Determination supervises the children at all times as required by the rules. The Home will develop or update a plan to obtain additional Staff help in case of an emergency.
