If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. #### 290-2-3-.13 Playgrounds(CR)

#### **Technical Assistance**

290-2-3-.13(2)(a) - The Consultant discussed with the Provider removing the large tree limbs and gumballs from the outdoor play area. The Consultant also discussed with the provider trimming the vegetation from the tree's and fence area.

#### Correction Deadline: 5/7/2023

#### Finding

290-2-3-.13(2)(d) requires that outside play areas be protected from traffic or other hazards by fencing or other barriers at least four feet in height and approved by the Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children. A fence shall be provided around swimming pools to make them inaccessible when not in use. It was determined based on observation that the back fence was bent and measured at three feet in height when the required measurement was four feet in height. It was further determined based on observation that the bottom section of the middle right side. It was also determined based on observation that the pole on the left and right side of the entrance gate had four protruding nails at the top portion of the fence.

#### **POI (Plan of Improvement)**

The Home will enclose the outside play area(s) with a four-foot high fence or other Department-approved barrier and inspect regularly to ensure fencing material is safe and any hazards identified are repaired or replaced. The Home will install or repair a fence around swimming pools that makes them inaccessible to children.

The annual ten (10) clock hours of training shall be chosen from the following fields: child development, including discipline, guidance, nutrition, injury control and safety; health, including sanitation, disease control, cleanliness, detection and disposition of illness; child abuse and neglect, including identification and reporting, and meeting the needs of abused and/or neglected children; and business related topics, including parental communication, recordkeeping, etc.; provided however that such business related training shall be limited to no more than two (2) of the required ten (10) clock hours of training. Records of completion of such training shall be maintained in the Home by the Provider, as required by these rules. It was determined based on review of records that staff #1 and staff #2 had not completed the annual ten (10) hours of training for the 2022 calendar year as required.

The Home will obtain the required annual training for Staff and will keep certificates, cards, or other proof of training on file. The Home will submit proof of training to the Department, if requested.
