- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Activities and Equipment

591-1-1-.03 Activities Not Met Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. It was determined, based on investigative findings that on December 28, 2022, at approximately 10:34 a.m., staff did not prevent two children from engaging in an activity that could be detrimental to the child's health when the staff did not take additional measures to keep two children separated that had previously been fighting repeatedly throughout the day. As a result, a two-year-old child sustained an injury to the left-side of the cheek while in the classroom. Correction Deadline: 3/14/2023

591-1-1-.12 Equipment & Toys(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. It was determined, based on investigative findings on January 2, 2023, at approximately 3:13 p.m., the staff stacked two tables on top of each other which posed a tipping hazard to the children in care. A two-year-old child sustained an injury to the toe while in the classroom when the child began playing by next to the tables and the table fell on the child's toe. Professional medical attention was sought for the child as a result.

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| Policies and Procedures 591-1-129 Required Reporting Not Met Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-129(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children; and any time the program's operating status changes (i.e., open to closed or temporarily closed and temporarily closed to open). It was determined, based on investigative findings, that on January 2, 2023, at approximately 3:13 p.m., a two-year-old child sustained an injury to the right toe from a table that fell onto the child's foot. The Center was notified that the child was taken for medical attention for the injury but failed to report the incident to the Department | | |

Finding Associated with Complaint

| 591-1-1-3.2(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined, based on investigative findings, that staff did not provide watchful oversight when a two-year-old child sustained an injury on December 9, 2022, when they were bitten by another child and staff were unaware of how the child was bitten. It was further determined that on January 5, 2023, a two-year-old child sustained a scratch mark on the face when staff failed to move children away from another child that was having a temper tantrum and scratched the child on the face. Additionally, on January 2, 2023, a staff did not provide watchful oversight when they stacked two tables on top of each other and was not aware that a child was near the tables. The table fell and caused an injury to the child's toe. |
