- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-129(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not imited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children; and any time the program's operating status changes (i.e., open to closed or temporarily closed and temporarily closed to open). It was determined based on a review of records, that on September 9, 2021, a five-year-old child was left on a vehicle at the center for an undetermined amount of time between ten minutes and one hour and twenty-three minutes. The center did not report the incident to the Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next business day.	/

591-1-1-.36 Transportation(CR)

Not Met

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.36(10) requires that a child never be left unattended in a vehicle. It was determined based on review of records that on September 9, 2021, following afternoon transportation from Crabapple Crossing Elementary School, a five-year-old child was left unattended on a vehicle for an undetermined amount of time between ten minutes and one hour and twenty-three minutes.

Correction Deadline: 10/25/2021
Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-136(7)(c)2. requires that the driver or other designated person shall immediately document in writing, with a check or other mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist each time a child enters and exits the vehicle. The driver or other designated staff person shall document in writing with a different mark/symbol to account for each child listed on the passenger transportation checklist who was not present on the vehicle for any reason. An explanation shall be documented in writing whenever a child is transported to a field trip site but is not present on the return trip to the Center. It was determined based on review of records, that on September 9, 2021, following afternoon transportation from Crabapple Crossing Elementary School, the driver or other designated person did not document in writing with a check or other mark/symbol to account for five of five children listed on the passenger transportation checklist. As a result, a five-year-old child was left unattended on the center vehicle for an undetermined amount of time between ten
minutes and one hour and twenty-three minutes.
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Correction Deadline: 10/25/2021
Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-136(7)(d)1. requires that the first check be conducted immediately upon unloading the last child at any location including, but not limited to, a field trip destination, arrival at the Center, and the last stop during transportation to home or school. The responsible person on the vehicle shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; sign the passenger transportation checklist (s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle; and give the passenger transportation checklist(s) to the second designated Staff person. It was determined based on review of records, that on September 9, 2021, following afternoon transportation from Crabapple Crossing Elementary School, the driver failed to complete a first check of the vehicle following routine transportation. As a result, a five-year-old child was left unattended on the center vehicle for an undetermined amount of time between ten minutes and one hour and twenty-three minutes.
Correction Deadline: 10/25/2021

591-1-136(7)(d)2. requires that the second designated Staff person conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. The responsible person shall physically walk through the entire vehicle; visually inspect all seat surfaces, under all seats and in all compartments or recesses in the vehicle's interior; and sign the passenger transportation checklist(s), indicating all of the children have exited the vehicle. There shall be continuous watchful oversight of the vehicle between the first check and second check. It was determined based on review of records, that on September 9, 2021, following afternoon transportation from Crabapple Crossing Elementary School, the second designated Staff person did not conduct a check of the vehicle immediately upon the completion of the first check of the vehicle. As a result, a five-year-old child was left unattended on the center vehicle for an undetermined amount of time between ten minutes and one hour and twenty-three minutes.

Staffing and Supervision
591-1-132 Supervision(CR) Not Met
Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and
capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on an investigation, that on September 9, 2021, center staff failed to provide supervision-watchful oversight, when a five-year-old child was left on a vehicle at the center for an undetermined amount of time between ten minutes and one hour and twenty-three minutes.
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
