An in person Initial Licensing Study and Complaint Investigation was conducted on July 1, 2021. The exit conference was conducted virtually on July 6, 2021 and July 14, 2021 at 10:00 am with Kathy Fuller. Permission to Operate issued on July 19, 2021. Facility does carry Liability Insurance. PTO was granted after the investigation was complete.

Advisement of Potential for Repeated Rule Violations during Pending Investigations

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on staff and children's statements, interviews, collaboration with The Department of Family and Children Services (DFCS) and other supporting documentation, that on June 21, 2021, a staff member failed to provide watchful oversight when a five-year-old child engaged in an inappropriate activity with an eight-year-old child while in the classroom. The incident occurred during naptime when the staff member responsible for watchful oversight of children did not see when a five-year-old child engaged in an inappropriate activity with an eight-year-old child in care. The staff member reported that she was on another side of the classroom and sitting on the floor when the incident occurred. The staff member reported that she observed that the five-year-old child had his pants undone and the eight-year-old child put a book over the five-year-old child's genitals to cover them. The staff member reported that the incident occurred within a five-minute time frame. According to the diagram of the classroom, several bookshelves and tables constricted the view of the classroom; therefore, the staff member was unable to see all the children on the other side of the classroom. Three (3) out of four (4) children interviewed also revealed that during naptime, they were unable to see the staff member in the classroom as the staff member was not present in the area.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor to ensure they are providing supervision and watchful oversight to the children at all times. The staff will ensure to position themselves in an area of the classroom that allows complete viewing of all children.
