- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. Please see GBI's website located at http://gbi.georgia.gov to access the Georgia Sex Offender Registry.

(O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

591-1-1-.29 Required Reporting

Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-129(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children; and any time the program's operating status changes (i.e., open to closed or temporarily closed and temporarily closed to open). It was determined that on March 13, 2020, staff failed to notify the Department within 24 hours or the next business day of a two-year-old child sustaining an injury to the left eye after falling and hitting their eye on the arm of a bench. It was revealed that staff could not attest to an injury sustained on an undetermined date in January 2021 It was also revealed that staff failed to notify the Department within 24 hours or the next business day of a two-year-old child sustaining an injury to their arm after being pulled up by their arm by a staff member. The allegation is substantiated.

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.11(2) requires that Personnel not: physically or sexually abuse a child or engage or permit others to engage in sexually overt conduct in the presence of any child enrolled in the Center; inflict corporal/physical punishment upon a child; shake, jerk, pinch or handle a child roughly; verbally abuse or humiliate a child which includes, but is not limited to, the use of threats, profanity or belittling remarks about a child or his family; isolate a child in a dark room, closet or unsupervised area; use mechanical or physical restraints or devices to discipline children; use medication to discipline or control children's behavior without written medical authorization issued by a licensed professional and given with the parent's written consent; restrict unreasonably a child from going to the bathroom; punish toileting accidents; force-feed a child or withhold feeding a child regularly scheduled meals and/or snacks; force or withhold naps; allow children to discipline or humiliate other children; or confine a child for disciplinary purposes to a swing, highchair, infant carrier, walker or jump seat. It was determined that there was a preponderance of evidence to substantiate the allegation reported. It was revealed through video observation that on March 15, 2021, staff was observed to pull the victim child up by the left arm to go to a nearby classroom on the opposite side of the carpet where the victim child was sitting. Staff reported that they picked the child up by the arm to lead the victim child over to the table during clean up up. Staff initially reported that they didn't know why the child was crying when management came to the classroom and the victim child was crying. It was revealed that staff could not attest to any incidents that occurred on an undetermined date in January 2021. The allegation is substantiated.

Staffing and Supervision

591-1-1-.32 Supervision(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.32(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities, mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times, and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs. Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined that on March 13, 2020, the victim child climbed on the bench in the toddler classroom to look through a window that separated the other classroom. It was also revealed that the victim child fell hitting their face on the arm rest of the bench which subsequently caused an cut to the left side of the eye. Staff was unable to provide a reasonable explanation as to the lack of supervision. Staff reported that ice was applied to reduce swelling and a picture was taken to send to the victim child's parent at which time the parent picked the child up early to assess the wound. Staff were alerted on Monday, March 16, 2020 that the victim child received stitches to the corner of the left eye. The allegation was substantiated.
