- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

.26(4) - This citation was corrected on this date. The playground fence was observed to be free of hazards and in good condition.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were observed:

PG C:Left Back:

- There was a red and yellow monkey bar structure with peeling paint.
- There was a red and yellow slide with peeling paint.
- There was a red and yellow car with peeling paint.

PG: A Right:

- There was a red, white, and blue slide that was missing pieces of the plastic surface.
- There was a red and yellow merry-go-round that was detached from the bottom spinning foundation.
- There was a discarded broken pink slide.

PG: B Right Back:

- There was a bucket swing structure with peeling paint.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will provide a variety of age-appropriate equipment that is arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. Staff will check the equipment daily to ensure that the equipment is free of hazards, rust and splinters.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based on observation the following hazards were observed:

PG:C Left Back playground:

-There were thorny vines alongside the left of the fence.

PG: A Right:

- There was an exposed green tarp covering a tree stump near the middle of the back fence.
- There were tree branches and pine cones across the playground...
- There were several wasps observed to be flying across the back right area of the playground.
- There was a broken green bucket near the inner back fence.

PG: B Right Back:

-There were several pine cones and tree branches on the playground.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(b) requires that the interior of a transportation vehicle be clean, in safe repair and free of hazardous items, objects and/or other non-essential items which could cause injury. It was determined based on observation that the left door inside of vehicle RSA3219 was missing the cover and did not open, there was a broken seat belt cover on the front row seat, missing vents and cup holders, and trash and debris across the floors. It was further determined based on observation the front row seat and arm rest cover were torn, there was one broken seatbelt cover, one missing door vent, missing vents at the top of the vehicle, and trash across the floors of vehicle RMG4814.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will maintain that all transportation vehicles are clean, in safe repair, and free from hazards.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(4)(c) requires that each vehicle be equipped with a fire extinguisher maintained in working order and kept inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the fire extinguisher on vehicle RSA3219 was empty and not in working order as required.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that each vehicle has a working fire extinguisher and that the fire extinguisher is kept out of reach of children.

Finding

591-1-1-.32(4)(a) requires that during the early morning times of arrival and late afternoon times of departure, infants and children younger than three (3) years may be grouped with older children so long as Staff: child ratios and group size are met based on the age of the youngest child in the group. It was determined based on observation that two-year old children were being housed with three and four-year old children during nap time.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will maintain Staff:child ratios based on the youngest child in the group during early morning and late afternoon times when children younger than three years of age may be grouped with older children.
