- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. Section 42.1.12(i)(2) requires Bright from the Start: Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning to notify licensed child care programs on accessing and retrieving from the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's (GBI) website a list of the names and addresses of all registered sexual offenders. You have the right to refute any of the citations noted in this report with which you disagree. To refute a citation(s), do the following:

<b>Finding</b> 591-1-125(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based upon observation that the following hazards were accessible to children on this date:
Room A  • One Staff purse was located on the top edge of a child's desk behind the diaper changing table which was open and accessible to children.  • A vacuum, a mop, and a bucket of water were in the bathroom.
Room D • One plunger was located in the girls bathroom. • One liquid hand soap located on the sink in the classroom was labeled "Keep Out of Reach of Children".
Room F  One liquid hand soap located on the sink in the main classroom was labeled "Keep Out of Reach of Children".  A toilet brush was in an unlocked drawer in the children's bathroom.  One mop and empty mop bucket were located in the children's bathroom.
<ul> <li>Room G</li> <li>A pack of Huggies Natural Care Sensitive wipes were in a child's book bag.</li> <li>One mop and empty mop bucket were located in the children's bathroom.</li> <li>A mop, broom, dust pan, and vacuum were located inside an unlocked closet.</li> </ul>

Finding 591-1-126(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based upon observation that the fourth section of the wooden fence had a hole at the bottom right of the fencing that measured two inches by two and a half inches and posed a potential entrapment hazard. It was further determined based upon observation that there were more than five bolts exposing more than two threads on the Back Playground. It was also determined based upon observation that there were 21 exposed bolts exposing more than two threads on the gate and back right chain length fence on the Front Playground.
Correction Deadline: 9/27/2023
Finding 591-1-126(6) requires that playground equipment provide an opportunity for the children to engage in a variety of experiences and shall be age-appropriate. For example, toddlers shall not be permitted to swing in swings designed for School-age Children. The outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. All equipment shall be arranged so as not to obstruct supervision of children. It was determined based upon observation that the following hazards were accessible to children on this date:
Front Playground  • The blue tractor was missing one steering wheel and had a broken steering wheel.  • The PVC piping surrounding the large play equipment was disconnect on the right back side of the playground.  • The funnel ball equipment had sharp and chipped edges along the exit points.
Back Playground  • There was one metal blue truck with three exposed bolts on the left hand side, six splintered wood slats located on the back of the truck, and rusted metal on the truck frame.  • There were three loose concrete bricks, three large rectangular pieces of wood, and one five gallon grey bucket underneath the stairs.

Finding 591-1-126(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined based upon observation that on the left playground near the back section there was an exposed concrete brick not flushed in the ground causing a potential tripping hazard. It was further determined based upon observation that the following hazards were accessible to children on this date:
Back Playground • Four exposed metal hooks were protruding from the ground located on the left and right hand sides of the far left playground area. • There was one exposed concrete brick used as a part of the stairs on the right hand side that was not flush with the ground causing a potential tripping hazard.
Front Playground  • There was a large piece of exposed concrete located at the bottom of the pole on the chain link fence on the front right hand side of the playground.  • There were two protruding and exposed roots to the right of the slide.  • A bag of Miracle Gro potting soil was located on the front left side of the playground.

# Finding 591-1-1-.32(1) requires the Center to maintain the required Staff:child ratios as follows: under 1 year or under 18 months if not walking = 1:6; 1 year and walking = 1:8; 2 years = 1:10; 3 years = 1:15; 4 years = 1:18; 5 years = 1:20; and 6 years and older = 1:25. A Center must establish groupings of children for care with maximum group sizes as follows: under 1 year = 12; under 18 months/not walking = 12; 1 year and walking = 16; 2 years = 20; 3 years = 30; 4 years = 36; 5 years = 40; and 6 years and older = 50. It was determined based upon observation that there was a staff:child ratio of 1:11 in Classroom A when one staff member briefly stepped into another room. A staff:child ratio for 2:11 was required.
