- 2) On the home page scroll down to the Inspection Reports and select 'Refute Citation' for the visit report in dispute
- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting documentation
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. (O.C.G.A. Section 20-1A-4)

Room A

•Two plastic grocery bags were located on the floor in between the red and black trash cans.

Room B

•Two plastic grocery bags were hanging from the right faucet handle.

•One pack of Huggies Natural Care baby wipes and one pack of Huggies Simply Clean baby wipes were located inside two children's book bags located on the floor to the right of the diaper changing table.

Room C

•One container of hand soap located on the right-hand side of the sink

Room D

•One toilet brush and one toilet plunger were located on the far side of the toilet on the left hand wall of the children's bathroom.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based upon observation that the following hazards on the playground were present on this date:

Playground C

•The fencing located on the front right side of the playground measured at three feet and 10 inches.

•The fencing bar from the front right side of the playground to the front back of the playground exposed rust.

Playground B

•The back left fence measured at three feet and six inches.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.
