- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

Finding

591-1-1-.15(2) requires that a signed written feeding plan for children less than one (1) year of age shall be obtained from Parent(s) and that instructions from the Parent(s) shall be updated regularly as new foods are added or other dietary changes are made. The feeding plan shall be posted in the child's assigned room and must include the child's feeding schedule, the amount of formula or breast milk to be given, instructions for the introduction of solid foods, the amount of food to be given and notation of any type(s) of commercially premixed formula which may not be used in an emergency because of food allergies. It was determined, based on review of records, that two of five infant feeding plans were lacking required information, as they were not the updated feeding plan. It was further determined that two of five infant feeding plans were lacking the times or amount of food and the parent signature and date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center Director will develop and implement a plan to obtain and post the completed feeding plan as part of the enrollment process and to have parents update the plans on a regular basis that will include center staff involved with enrollment and those working in the infant classrooms.

Finding

591-1-1-.15(7) requires that food be served according to manufacturer's instructions and recommendations. Foods that are associated with young children's choking incidents, such as, but not limited to, peanuts, hot dogs, raw carrots, popcorn, fish with bones, cheese cubes, grapes and any other food that is of similar shape and size of the trachea/windpipe shall not be served to the children less than four (4) years of age. Children older than four (4) years of age may be served these foods provided that the foods are cut in such a way as to minimize choking. Food shall not be accessible or served to children until it has been chopped, diced, cut or mashed and is appropriate for each child's age and individual eating, chewing and swallowing ability. It was determined, based on review of records, that the menu indicated that sausage links were served for breakfast on October 5, 2021. It was further determined that the menu indicated that smoked sausage was served for lunch on October 6, 2021 and for breakfast on October 7, 2021. It was further determined that hot dogs were served for lunch on October 8, 2021.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor food served and accessible to children to ensure that the food does not present a choking hazard.

Finding

591-1-1-.36(7)(b) requires that an emergency medical information record be maintained in the vehicle for each child being transported. The emergency medical information record for each child shall include a listing of the child's full name, date of birth, allergies, special medical needs and conditions, current prescribed medications that the child is required to take on a daily basis for a chronic condition, the name and telephone number of the child's doctor, the local medical facility that the Center uses in the area where the Center is located and the telephone numbers where the Parents can be reached. It was determined, based on review of records, that six of twenty emergency medical information records were lacking the name and/or phone number of the child's primary physician.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will obtain a complete emergency medical information record for each child that is transported and maintain a copy on the vehicle.

Finding

591-1-Ī-.36(8) restricts a child's travel time to forty-five minutes on each trip between the Center and destination unless accompanied by the Parent and excluding field trips. It was determined, based on review of records, that children's travel time exceeded 45 minutes during morning routine transportation during the week of October 4, 2021 from the center to Belair K-8 School and Richmond K-8 School. It was further determined that children's travel time exceeded 45 minutes during afternoon routine transportation during the week of October 4, 2021 to the center from Dorothy Hains Elementary School.

The center will ensure that the travel time is no more than forty-five minutes on each trip.

Finding

591-1-1-.14(2) requires a Staff member who is trained in CPR and first aid to be on the premises and on any field trip whenever any child is present. In addition, Staff who provide direct care to children must satisfactorily obtain certification in first aid and CPR by December 29, 2016 if employed prior to September 30, 2016 and within 90 days of their hire date if employed after September 30, 2016. It was determined, based on review of records, that Staff #3 was lacking current evidence of First Aid and CPR training on this date, as the staff person had evidence of expired training on this date. It was further determined that Staff #5 was lacking evidence of completing the hands-on component of CPR training, as the staff person had evidence of completing online CPR training on this date.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will develop a schedule to ensure there is always a staff person with current first aid and CPR training present and will develop and implement a plan to ensure all staff members have satisfactorily completed first aid and CPR training by the specified date.

Finding

591-1-1-.14(3) requires the Center to have a first aid kit in each building of the Center and in any vehicle used by the Center for transportation of children, that contains scissors, tweezers, gauze pads, adhesive tape, thermometer, band-aids, assorted sizes, antibacterial ointment, insect-sting preparation, an antiseptic cleansing solution, triangular bandages, rubber gloves, protective eye wear, a protective face mask, and a cold pack. The first aid kit, together with a first aid instruction manual which must be kept with the kit at all times, shall be stored so that it is not accessible to children but is easily accessible to Staff. It was determined, based on observation, that the following first aid kits were missing the following items:

- The first aid kit for the center was missing the anti-bacterial ointment and the triangular bandage on this date.
- The first aid kit for vehicle with tag number CME4470 used for routine transportation was missing the thermometer, scissors, tweezers, adhesive tape, anti-bacterial ointment, insect sting preparation, triangular bandage, cold pack, and protective eye wear.
- The first aid kit for vehicle with tag number ABQ6784 used for routine transportation was missing the thermometer, scissors, tweezers, anti-bacterial ointment, insect sting preparation, triangular bandage, and protective eye wear.
- The first aid kit for vehicle with tag number CLI5865 used for routine transportation was missing the thermometer, scissors, adhesive tape, anti-bacterial ointment, insect sting preparation, triangular bandage, cold pack, and protective eye wear.
- The first aid kit for vehicle with tag number ABQ6785 used for routine transportation was missing the insect sting preparation.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

Center Staff will provide any missing first aid kits, add any missing items to each first aid kit and will develop and use a plan for checking the kits and replacing missing items in each kit in the future. First aid kits and instruction manuals will be stored so that they kits are not accessible to children but are easily accessible to Center Staff.
