Staff files, children's files, training, and background checks were all reviewed. The Consultant completed exit conference virtually and a copy of the licensing study/monitoring visit report was electronically emailed to the Program on August 3, 2022...

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Finding 591-1-114(1) requires the Center Director and, at any given time, at least fifty percent (50%) of the caregiver Staff to successfully complete a biennial training program in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and a triennial training program in first aid. The first aid training must be done by certified or licensed health care professionals or trainers and must deal with the provision of emergency care to infants and children. The Center shall maintain current evidence of the successful completion of such training which shall be available to the Department for inspection. It was determined, based on review of records, that the Director and less than 50% of the caregiver Staff had completed first aid and CPR training, as no documentation was available for review for First Aid and CPR on this date. The center had scheduled first aid and CPR training for April 30, 2022, which was cancelled by the instructor. The training has been rescheduled for August 27, 2022.

Finding 591-1-114(1)(a) requires, in a Center that provides transportation, that either the driver or another Staff person present on the vehicle have current evidence of successful completion of a biennial training program in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and a triennial training program in first aid offered by certified or licensed health care professionals or trainers and which dealt with the provision of emergency care to infants and children. It was determined, based on review of records, that no staff present on the vehicles during routine transportation had current evidence of successful completion of first aid and CPR training on this date. No documentation was available for review for First Aid and CPR on this date. The center had scheduled first aid and CPR training for April 30, 2022, which was cancelled by the instructor. The training has been rescheduled for August 27, 2022.

Finding 591-1-114(2) requires a Staff member who is trained in CPR and first aid to be on the premises and on any field trip whenever any child is present. In addition, Staff who provide direct care to children must satisfactorily obtain certification in first aid and CPR by December 29, 2016 if employed prior to September 30, 2016 and within 90 days of their hire date if employed after September 30, 2016. It was determined, based on review of records, that the center was operating without a staff member trained in first aid and CPR being on premises, as required. The center had scheduled first aid and CPR training for April 30, 2022, which was cancelled by the instructor. The training has been rescheduled for August 27, 2022.

Finding 591-1-133(3) requires each Staff member with direct care responsibilities to complete health and safety orientation training within the first 90 days of employment. The state-approved training hours obtained will count toward required first year training hours. The training must address the following health and safety topics: prevention and control of infectious diseases (including immunizations); prevention of sudden infant death syndrome and use of safe sleeping practices; administration of medication, consistent with standards for parental consent; prevention of and response to emergencies due to food and allergic reactions; building and physical premises safety, including identification of and protection from hazards that can cause bodily injury such as electrical hazards, bodies of water, and vehicular traffic; prevention of shaken baby syndrome, abusive head trauma and child maltreatment; emergency preparedness and response planning for emergencies resulting from a natural disaster or a human-caused event (such as violence at a child care facility); handling and storage of hazardous materials and the appropriate disposal of bio contaminants; precautions in transporting children; recognition and reporting of child abuse and neglect; and child development. It was determined, based on review of records, that Staffs # 3 and 17 were lacking evidence of completing the Health and Safety Orientation training within 90 days of employment, as required.
