### **Comments**

A virtual inspection was conducted on this date with the Provider. An in-person visit was not conducted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. An Administrative Review was conducted on June 9, 2022. Staff files, children's files, training, and background checks were all reviewed. The Consultant completed exit conference virtually and a copy of licensing study/monitoring visit report was electronically emailed to the Program on June 9, 2022.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





## Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

Such records shall include: identifying information (Child's name, birth date, Parent's name, home and business addresses, telephone numbers); name, address and telephone number of persons, including Child's physician, to contact in emergencies; and name, address, telephone numbers, relationship to Child and to Parent(s) and other identifying information of person(s) to whom the Child may be released. It was determined, based on review of records, that two enrolled children were lacking the information for the emergency contact on this date. It was further determined that one enrolled child was lacking the information for the child's release person(s) on this date.

## **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will obtain the missing information and maintain the Children's records as required.

### **Finding**

290-2-3-.08(2) requires the Home to maintain a file for each Child that includes evidence of age-appropriate immunizations or a signed affidavit against such immunizations; enrollment in the Home may not continue for more than 30 days without such evidence. It was determined, based on review of records, that two enrolled children were lacking current evidence of age-appropriate immunizations on this date.

## **Finding**

290-2-3-.11(1)(f) requires diapers to be changed in the Child's own crib or on a nonporous surface which is cleaned with a disinfectant and dried with a single use disposable towel after each diaper change. It was determined, based on observation, that Staff were observed to change a diaper on a diaper changing surface that was observed to be not smooth and could not be thoroughly cleaned with a disinfectant on this date. The Provider switched out the diaper changing surface to a smooth nonporous surface during the virtual walk through on this date.

#### **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

To ensure the control of disease transmission, the Home Provider will change diapers in the child's crib or a nonporous surface. The diapering surface will be cleaned and disinfected between use with a single use disposable towel.
