- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

## **Finding**

591-1-1-.25(3) requires the Center and surrounding premises to be kept clean, free of debris and in good repair. Hygienic measures such as, but not limited to, screened windows and proper waste disposal procedures shall be utilized to minimize the presence of rodents, flies, roaches and other vermin at the Center. It was determined based on consultant observation that the shelves and toys had dirt present and there was clutter on top of cubbies and changing tables. Further the coating on the toilet seat in the fist bathroom in Room B was chipped or rubbed off of the seat.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will have the Center and surrounding areas cleaned, make repairs where needed, and remove all debris is removed. The Center will implement a plan to keep areas clean and in good repair that includes regular monitoring. Shelves will be wiped, changing table areas and the tops of cubbies will be kept clean, toys will be cleaned, and the toilet seat will be replaced.

## 591-1-1-.26 Playgrounds(CR)

**Not Met** 

## **Finding**

591-1-1-.26(9) requires the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. It was determined base on Consultant observation that these hazards were present:

Playground A--stump was present that had jagged pieces and sharp edges, gas can with gasoline in the can and six tricycles without handles were present.

Playground B--sticks, thorns, and weeds grew through the back and side of the fence that was next to the road, a board was broke at the bottom of the second fence panel from the left and jagged pieces were present, two tricycles without handles, the red and blue playground equipment had rust and chipped paint, a stump was present next to the tree that was fenced in with boards, and the last two window sills in front of Room C were rotted.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will remove any litter and fix or remove hazards from the playground and will routinely monitor the playground and remove litter and hazards. Playground A--The Director said the stump would be cut off and made smooth, the gas can was removed from the playground, and the Director ordered tennis balls to place on the handles of the tricycles.

Playground B--The Director began to cut the sticks, thorns, and weeds out of and off of the fence on the date of the visit, duct tape was placed on the jagged pieces until the board could be cut, tennis balls were ordered for the six tricycles without handles, the red and blue playground equipment will be sanded and painted, and the stump that was outside of the fenced tree would be painted with a bright spray paint.

## **Technical Assistance**

The Consultant discussed with the Director that baby bottles and formula were to be labeled with the individual child's name; supplied by the Parent daily in bottles; and refrigerated at a temperature of forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or less. Only the current day's formula or breast milk shall be served. If formula must be provided by the Center, only commercially prepared, ready-to-feed formula shall be used. Refrigerated or frozen breast milk shall only be heated or thawed under warm running water or in a container of warm water.

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.15(7) requires that food be served according to manufacturer's instructions and recommendations. Foods that are associated with young children's choking incidents, such as, but not limited to, peanuts, hot dogs, raw carrots, popcorn, fish with bones, cheese cubes, grapes and any other food that is of similar shape and size of the trachea/windpipe shall not be served to the children less than four (4) years of age. Children older than four (4) years of age may be served these foods provided that the foods are cut in such a way as to minimize choking. Food shall not be accessible or served to children until it has been chopped, diced, cut or mashed and is appropriate for each child's age and individual eating, chewing and swallowing ability. It was determined based the menu that was posted and popcorn that was observed in the kitchen that popcorn was served as a snack and a choking hazard was posed.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will train Staff and monitor food served and accessible to children to ensure that the food does not present a choking hazard. An updated menu was provided that reflected popcorn was removed from the menu.

## Finding

591-1-1-.07(5) requires Center Staff to not permit children to wear around their necks or attach to their clothing pacifiers or other hazardous items. It was determined based on Consultant review that an infant was asleep in a crib and had a pacifier clip attached to their clothing.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will instruct Staff regarding this safety requirement. The Center will notify parents that pacifier clips are not allowed while their children are at the Center.

## 591-1-1-.10 Diapering Areas & Practices(CR)

**Not Met** 

## Finding

591-1-1-.10(4) requires that if diapers are changed on a diaper changing surface, the surface shall be smooth, nonporous, and equipped with a guard or rails to prevent falls. Between each diaper change, the diaper changing surface shall be cleaned with a disinfectant and dried with a single-use disposable towel. It was determined based on Consultant observation that the changing changing surface in the Main B classroom was ripped and had exposed foam and was not porous as required.

## **POI** (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure there is a smooth, nonporous changing surface that has a guard or rails for safety in each classroom that houses children wearing diapers. Center Staff will be trained and have adequate supplies to properly clean the diaper changing surface between each diaper change. The center will remove the changing mat and will replace it when a new one is received.

## 591-1-1-.17 Hygiene(CR)

## **Finding**

591-1-1-17(7) requires that children wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water upon arrival for care, when moving from one child care group to another, upon re-entering the child care area after outside play, before and after eating meals and snacks, handling or touching food, playing in water; after toileting and diapering, playing in sand, touching animals or pets, and contact with bodily fluids and after contamination by any other means. It was determined based on staff statements that infants hands were not washed with liquid soap and warm running water after their diapers were changed, and only a wipe was used during the change. Further, a three-year-old arrived at the center during the visit and their hands were not washed upon arrival.

## **POI (Plan of Improvement)**

The Center will train Staff on required handwashing for children and Staff will ensure children's hands are washed when required. The Director will monitor for compliance.

Further redirection should be used for disciplinary measures and if time out is used that a child cannot be placed in time out longer than one minute per their age.

## Sleeping & Resting Equipment

## 591-1-1-.30 Safe Sleeping and Resting Requirements(CR)

**Not Met** 

#### **Finding**

591-1-1-.30(1)(a)3 requires that each crib shall have only an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant. It was determined based on Consultant observation that the crib sheets were not tight-fitted and a suffocation hazard was posed.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The center will ensure that each crib has an individual, tight-fitting sheet which is changed daily or more often as needed and prior to a change of occupant.

Correction Deadline: 2/1/2022

## **Technical Assistance**

The Consultant discussed with the staff member that every child was required to have a sheet on their cot during nap time.

Correction Deadline: 2/1/2022

#### Finding

591-1-1-.30(1)(b)4 requires that a light cover be available for each child's use on a cot or mat and shall be marked for individual use or laundered daily. If marked for individual use, they must be laundered weekly or more frequently if needed. It was determined based on Consultant observation that five children in Room C did not have blankets during nap time as required.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that a light cover is available for each child and will meet the requirements for laundering.

## Correction Deadline: 2/1/2022

## **Finding**

591-1-1-.30(1)(d) requires that all sleeping and resting equipment shall be arranged to avoid obstructing access to exit doors, to provide the caregivers access to each child, and to prevent children's access to cords hanging from window treatments and other hazardous objects. To reduce the transfer of airborne diseases, sleeping and resting equipment shall be arranged as follows. There shall be a minimum of twenty-four inch (24") corridor between each row of sleeping or resting equipment. There shall be a minimum of twelve inches (12") between each piece of sleeping or resting equipment in each row of equipment. Children shall be placed on cots and mats so that one child's head is toward another child's feet in the same row. It was determined that the children in Room C were not placed where their head was towards another child's feet in the same row.

## POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will arrange and place sleeping and resting equipment according to the requirements in the rule; will train Staff; and will monitor for continued compliance.
