- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

O.C.G.A. It was determined on June 7, 2023, a five-year-old child sustained a fractured wrist after falling from a slide on the playground. It was reported that the children were climbing up the slide and there was a collision and the injured child fell and fractured their wrist. It was reported that staff members did not properly redirect the children from improperly using the playground equipment. The child received professional medical attention.
