- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- · All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint
591-1-1-.03(9) requires center staff to refrain from engaging in, or allowing children or other adults to engage in, activities that could be detrimental to a child's health or well-being, such as but not limited to, horse play, rough play, wrestling, and picking up a child in a manner that could cause injury. it was determined that on March 8, 2023 an enrolled child gained access to the fire extinguisher on the center bus when the child was being allowed to sit in the front seat, and was asked to pick up the fire extinguisher. The safety pin was dislodged out of the fire extinguisher and the fire extinguishing agent blew out on the children on the center van.

591-1-1-.36 Transportation(CR)

Finding Associated with Complaint

591-1-1-.36(4)(b) requires that the interior of a transportation vehicle be clean, in safe repair and free of hazardous items, objects and/or other non-essential items which could cause injury. It was determined based on observation and investigative findings that van ending in tag 6935 had doors that would both not properly open in that the right side would open, but the left side would not open and children were required to enter and exit from the one door.

Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-136(4)(c) requires that each vehicle be equipped with a fire extinguisher maintained in working order and kept inaccessible to children. It was determined based on investigative findings on March 6, 2023 an eleven-year-old child had access to the van fire extinguisher as the child was in the front seat of the van and picked up the fire extinguisher which released while enrolled children were on the van causing the children to evacuate the van.
Correction Deadline: 3/15/2023
Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-136(4)(f)1. requires that all transported children be secured in a child passenger restraining system or seat safety belt in accordance with current state and federal laws and regulations and according to manufacturer's directions. It was determined based on investigative findings that state laws and regulations were not followed in that children under the age of eight-years-old were not required to sit in booster seats, children on the van were not required to wear seat belts and an eleven-year-old child was being allowed to sit in the front seat of the van.
Correction Deadline: 3/15/2023
Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-136(4)(f)2. requires that no vehicle shall exceed the manufacturer's rated seating capacity and that proof of the seating capacity is maintained on file. It was determined that on March 8, 2023 the center were transporting 16 children on a 15 passage van.
