

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

Finding Associated with Complaint 591-1-129(3) requires the Director or designated person-in-charge to report or cause to be reported to the Department within twenty-four (24) hours or the next work day: any death of a child while in the care of the Center; any serious illness or injury requiring hospitalization or professional medical attention other than first aid of a child while in the care of the Center; any situation when a child in care becomes missing, such as, but not limited to, a child who is left on a vehicle, a child who leaves the building, playground, or property, or a child who is left behind on any trip; any fire; any structural disaster; any emergency situation that requires temporarily relocating children; and any time the program's operating status changes (i.e., open to closed or temporarily closed and temporarily closed to open). It was determined based on investigative findings that on October 25, 2021, a one-year-old child was not immediately located at the time of their pick up from the center. The child was found unsupervised in an unoccupied classroom area. This information was not self-reported to the Department.

## **Finding Associated with Complaint**

591-1-132(7) requires that children be supervised at all times appropriate to the individual age, needs and
capabilities of each child. Such supervision must include, but not be limited to, indoor and outdoor activities,
mealtimes, naptime, transportation, field trips, and transitions between activities. "Supervision" means that the
appropriate number of Staff members are physically present in the area where children are being cared for and
are providing watchful oversight to the children, volunteers and Students-in-Training. The persons supervising
in the child care area must be alert, positioned to maximize their ability to hear and see the children at all times,
and able to respond promptly to the needs and actions of the children being supervised, as well as the actions
of the volunteers and Students-in-Training, and provide timely attention to the children's actions and needs.
Staff shall be attentive and participating with all children during mealtimes and shall be seated within an arm's
length away from children thirty-six (36) months of age and younger. It was determined based on investigative
findings that on October 25, 2021, a one-year-old child exited the center as they followed a staff member out of
the center's front entrance. The staff member did not see the child exit the building behind them. The child was
found in the first parking space of the center's parking lot by a center parent and returned to the center. No
professional medical attention was reported. Additionally, it was determined based on investigative findings that
on October 25, 2021, a second one-year-old child was not properly transitioned to their classroom at the end of
the day. The child was found unsupervised in an unoccupied classroom area at the time of the child's pick up.
No professional medical attention was reported. The incident was not self-reported to the Department.
