#### Finding

591-1-1-.06(4) requires a Center first licensed after March 1, 1991, and Centers that remodel or add to existing plumbing facilities, to have the bathroom area fully enclosed and ventilated to the outside of the building with either an open screened window or functioning exhaust fan and duct system and requires Centers without fully enclosed bathrooms to ensure there is adequate ventilation to control odors and adequate sanitation measures to prevent the spread of contagious diseases. It was determined based on observation that the boys and girls bathroom did not have a functioning exhaust fan for ventilation. Additionally, in the girls bathroom there was one cracked ceiling tile and the light fixture was without a covering.

It was determined based on a review of records that staff number nine did not complete health and safety orientation training within the first 90 days of employment as required.
