Background checks for all staff were reviewed during the walk through visit. The annual review was completed on April 25, 2022, and a copy of the report was emailed to the provider on this day.

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee

The consultant discussed the requirement that equipment and furniture be placed so as to permit the children's freedom of movement and to minimize danger of accident and collision. Chairs stacked on a table in room D of the main building were placed back on the floor by the staff.

The consultant discussed the requirement that toys for children be free of sharp pieces, edges or points. The sink buckets in the play kitchens of Class Room D in the main building and in Class Room E of building 2 were cracked. The director stated they would be replaced.

The consultant discussed the requirement that the outdoor equipment shall be free of lead-based paint, sharp corners and shall be regularly maintained in such a way as to be free of rust and splinters that could pose significant safety hazard to the children. The consultant discussed with the director about removing the cracked playhouse on Playground 1 and the cracked piece of play equipment on Playground 2.

Correction Deadline: 4/9/2022

Technical Assistance

The consultant discussed the requirement that the playground to be kept clean, free from litter and free of hazards, such as but not limited to rocks, exposed tree roots and exposed sharp edges of concrete. Tree roots were exposed in various spots on the playground. The director stated they would spray the tree roots with brightly colored paint to prevent tripping hazards.

Technical Assistance

There was a one-year-old child in the classroom of building 3 that was napping with a sippy cup of juice. The consultant discussed the requirement that Center Personnel ensure that children shall always be seated when eating and drinking. Staff should be aware of complications, such as choking, associated with an infant's drinking in a reclining position and with falling asleep with a bottle of breast milk, formula, milk, juice, etc. in the mouth.

Finding

591-1-1-.15(3) requires baby bottles and formula to be labeled with the individual child's name; supplied by the Parent daily in bottles; and refrigerated at a temperature of forty (40) degrees Fahrenheit or less. Only the current day's formula or breast milk shall be served. If formula must be provided by the Center, only commercially prepared, ready-to-feed formula shall be used. Refrigerated or frozen breast milk shall only be heated or thawed under warm running water or in a container of warm water. It was determined based on observation that the temperatures in the refrigerator of Class Room C of Building 1 was 52 degrees Fahrenheit and in the refrigerator the Classroom of building 3 was 57 degrees Fahrenheit and not the required temperature of 40 degrees or less.

The Center will train Staff to follow the required procedures, ensure that parents are fully informed, and will review and monitor regularly.
