Comments

An in-person walkthrough of the facility was conducted on February 15, 2022. A letter requesting documents be uploaded by February 23, 2022, for the annual review was left with the director after the walkthrough. Background checks for all staff were reviewed during the walk though visit. The annual review was completed on March 2, 2022, and a copy of the report was emailed to the provider on this day.

Plan of Improvement: No Plan Developed

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important New Deadlines:

Due to the ongoing COVID restrictions, the deadline to become Quality Rated for programs who want to continue to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS), has been extended to at least December 31, 2021.

If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Activities and Equipment

290-2-3-.12 Equipment and Supplies(CR)

Not Met

Finding

290-2-3-.12(3) requires furniture and equipment to be kept clean and in a safe usable condition. It was determined based on observation that two booster seats in the kitchen did not have the required safety straps.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will clean, repair, and/or replace any item(s) noted and will maintain furniture and equipment so they are clean, safe and usable.

The feeding high chair was without a cover and the consultant discussed with the provider ordering a replacement.

Finding

290-2-3-.12(6) requires all indoor and outdoor furniture, activity materials, and equipment shall be placed so as to permit the children's freedom of movement and to minimize danger of accident or collision. It was determined based on observation that the play area was not arranged as to permit children's freedom of movement and to minimize danger of accident or collision.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will rearrange any unsafe furniture and/or equipment and will place so as to permit children's freedom of movement without accidents or collisions.

Correction Deadline: 2/15/2022

Finding

290-2-3-.12(7) requires all indoor and outdoor furniture and equipment shall be secured if equipment and furniture is of a weight or mass that could cause injury from tipping, falling, or being pulled or pushed over. Potentially unstable equipment and furniture that might injure a child if not secured include, but are not limited to, televisions, chests of drawers, bookcases, shelving, cabinets and fish tanks. Examples of items not required to be secured include, but are not limited to, child-sized tables and chairs, rocking chairs, and cribs. It was determined based on observation that cabinets in the eating area were sagging and propped up by boards and cinder blocks.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home will secure any identified equipment and/or furniture to prevent from tipping or falling over on a child. The Home Provider will ensure that all potentially dangerous equipment is maintained secure. The provider will install permanent columns that will secure the cabinets from falling.

Correction Deadline: 2/15/2022

Finding

290-2-3-.12(9) requires that toys be stored on low, open shelves and easily accessible to children in each room or assigned area. It was determined based on observation that toys were not easily accessible to children in care.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will rearrange the toys so that they are appropriately accessible to the children in care. The home provider stated that the home was under renovation and that toys would be arranged for accessibility.

- -The bathroom shower had shampoo and soap products labeled keep out of reach of children on the shelves.
- -On the floor of the bathroom next to the toilet was a toilet plunger.
- -Plastic bags were stored under the bathroom sink in an unlocked cabinet.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

To ensure the cleanliness and safety of the environment, the Home Provider will make hazardous items inaccessible to the children.

The provider stated that they planned to have the playground back opened in two weeks.

No animal that may be vicious is permitted on the premises while children are present. Farm animals cannot be housed within 500 feet of the home. It was determined based on observation that a cat was not confined and allowed to roam the home. Additionally, a dog was in a two foot fence with open access for the dog and children to possibly interact.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Home Provider will ensure that proper sanitation is maintained and that animals are not a hazard to anyone on the premises of the Home. Any animal that may have a vicious propensity, shall not be allowed on the premises of the Home any time children are present. Any farm animals on the property, must not be housed within 500 feet of the Home.
