The purpose of this visit was to conduct a Licensing Study and follow up on previous rule violations.

Serious or continued noncompliance may also jeopardize participation in one or more DECAL program(s).



Please refer to the website, http://www.decal.ga.gov/CCS/RulesAndRegulations.aspx, for information regarding October 1, 2018 rule changes about Criminal Records Checks that may affect your facility. In summary,

- New records checks will be required to be completed if a staff member experiences a six month break in service from the child care industry
- New clearance is required at least once every five years
- Any staff member solely responsible for supervising children will be required to have completed a comprehensive background clearance
- All staff members are required to have completed at least a national fingerprint based clearance check
- Any staff member with only the national fingerprint based clearance, must be under constant and direct supervision of a staff member with a satisfactory comprehensive records check clearance
- Facilities are required to use DECAL KOALA for Criminal Records Checks, including to verify portability of an employee





Important Quality Rated/CAPS Update:

As January 1, 2022, child care providers must be Quality Rated to receive Childcare and Parent Services (CAPS). Newly licensed, or new to CAPS providers may be eligible for the new CAPS/QR Provisional Status, allowing for scholarships while working toward a star rating.

- 3) Select the specific rule number(s) that you are refuting, add the reason for disagreement regarding the rule citation, and upload supporting
- 4) Submit the refutation in DECAL KOALA to Child Care Services (CCS) within 10 business days of the completion date.

Bright from the Start recommends that all licensed child care providers carry liability insurance coverage sufficient to protect its clients. If you do not have this liability insurance, you are required to post a notice with ½ inch letters in a conspicuous location in the program, notify the parent or guardian of each child in care in writing, obtain their signature to acknowledge receipt and maintain this written acknowledgment on file at the program at all times while the child attends the program and for 12 months after the child's last date of attendance. Activities and Equipment

591-1-1-.12 Equipment & Toys(CR)

A variety of equipment and toys were observed throughout the center.

Finding

591-1-1-.12(2) requires that all equipment and furniture be free from hazardous conditions such as, but not limited to, sharp rough edges or toxic paint; and be kept clean. It was determined based on observation that the following equipment was in need of repair or should be removed:

- -classroom A a circular swing was hanging and rope was looped and accessible, creating a strangulation hazard, the bathroom counter front cabinet surfacing was developing chipping paint, the toilet top was broken and repaired with tape
- -classroom C- the soft climbing blocks had rips in the material and exposed foam, the sink counter was developing chipping
- -classroom B- the cabinet under the changing table was missing a knob, with an exposed screw

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will ensure that equipment and furniture are used by the age-appropriate group of children.

Finding

591-1-1-.25(13) requires that potentially hazardous equipment, materials and supplies be stored in a locked area inaccessible to children. It was determined based on observation that the following hazards were stored accessible

- -classroom C a staff bag was stored low and accessible to children, on top of the children's cots
- -classroom B- the diaper table drawer safety latch was broken where diaper ointments and cleaning products were stored, as well as the cabinet under the sink was unlocked, containing cleaning products, accessible to children -front foyer area leading to the playground - bug spray and sunscreen was stored on a low shelf, accessible to children
- -classroom A a tube of destin was stored in a low cubby, accessible to children All items were labeled 'keep out of reach of children'

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will identify all hazardous items and keep them in a locked area inaccessible to children. The Center will inform all Staff about hazardous items and the safe storage of those items.

Finding

591-1-1-.26(4) requires that playgrounds be protected from traffic or other hazards by a (4) four foot high fence or other barrier approved by this Department. Fencing material shall not present a hazard to children and shall be maintained so as to prevent children from leaving the playground area by any means other than through an approved access route. Fence gates shall be kept closed except when persons are entering or exiting the area. It was determined based on observation the following areas were in need of repair:

- -back left playground fencing there were 10 wooden slats observed missing, with exposed nails
- -back right playground fencing- two areas of slats were observed to be loose
- -front walkway leading to left playground area there was gap between two slats measuring more than three and half inches, creating an entrapment hazard

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will routinely check the fence to determine if it is in good repair and remains at least 4 feet high, and will repair any hazards. The Center will train Staff to identify and report any fence hazards and to keep the fence gates closed when not in use.

Finding

591-1-1-.15(4) requires that a feeding chair or similar equipment designed for feeding children shall be provided for the use of each child being fed who is capable of sitting up but who is unable to sit unassisted at a table and must be cleaned with a disinfectant after each use. Such chair or similar equipment shall have a broad base to prevent tipping, a surface that the child cannot raise, a strap or other device which prevents the child from sliding out of the chair, and a feeding surface free of cracks. It was determined based on observation that three one-year-old children were observed to be seated in feeding chairs in classroom B and the children were not strapped in with the chairs provided/required safety straps.

POI (Plan of Improvement)

The Center will inspect feeding equipment to ensure it meets each of the listed criteria and to verify a feeding chair or equipment is provided for each child who requires one. The Center will train staff and monitor to ensure that the feeding equipment is cleaned with a disinfectant after each use and children are properly strapped in.

Please ensure all children under the age of one-year-old are provided an individual crib each day for sleep/rest time.

The Center will provide a crib that is safety approved in compliance with CPSC and ASTM safety standards for each infant.
