922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

(a) Hired after January 1, 2009, who have supervisory power over a minor and are not enrolled in secondary education, shall have a: 1. High school diploma:

- 2. GED or qualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity; or
- 3. Commonwealth Child Care Credential as described in 922 KAR 2:250;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the records for the employee with the hire date of 02/28/2018 contained a copy of a High school diploma: or a GED or gualifying documentation from a comparable educational entity or Commonwealth Child Care Credential.

395 - TB Verification

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

(1) Child-care center staff:

- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or

2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that the record for the employee with the hire date of 06/17/2013 contained a current copy of a statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or a copy of negative tuberculin results.

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922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements. (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:

(a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

(b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

(c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

Findings:

410 - Training

General: Based on review of documentation and interview, the child care center failed to maintain employee records in accordance with regulatory requirements. Upon request, the child care director did not present verification that a staff member with the hire date of 01/30/2017 had met the requirement of Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment. Review of documentation in the ECE-TRIS training system revealed the staff member listed above had not met the requirement.

(1) The premises shall be:

(a) Suitable for the purpose intended;

(b) Kept clean and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. The beige carpet located in the gross motor space area had a one-inch tear that ran the length of the classroom. Continued observation revealed the white doors throughout the center were stained with black smudge marks. The beige walls in the two-year-old classroom contained several areas where the paint was chipped and in need of repair.

650 - Toilet

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.
(4) Each toilet shall:
(a) Be kept in clean condition;
(b) Be kept in good repair;
(c) Be in a lighted room; and
(d) Have ventilation to outside air.
Findings:
General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the bathroom located in the pre-

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain the premises in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of the bathroom located in the preschool classroom revealed there were dried urine stains around the base of the toilet. The restroom located in the three-year-old classroom had rubber baseboard that was pulling away from the wall.

 922 KAR 2:120. Section 11. Toys and Furnishings. (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall: (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair; (b) Meet the physical, developmental needs, and interests of children of different age groups; (c) Be free from sharp points or corners, splinters, protruding nails or bolts, loose or rusty parts, hazardous small parts, lead-based paint, poisonous material, and flaking or chalking paint; and (d) Be designed to guard against entrapment or situations that may cause strangulation. 				

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. The play kitchen micro-wave set, located in the preschool classroom, had a door that was hanging loosely from the hinges and the play kitchen sink was missing a cabinet door. Continued observation revealed that the green bookshelf located in the preschool classroom had a nail that was protruding from the top of the book case. The second green book shelf had two (2) places where the particle board was broken with metal screws exposed on the top shelf.

General: Based on observation, the child care center failed to maintain equipment in accordance with regulatory requirements. Observation of various toys located throughout the classrooms revealed a number of battery-operated toys that were not maintained and used according to the manufacturer's safety specifications; the batteries were non-operational.
