Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:400E. Emergency Regulation.

Due to the current declared public health emergency caused by the Novel Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19), licensed child care centers must operate under Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and public health guidelines, as mandated by 922 KAR 2:400E, to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found that two (2) staff persons not wearing Personal Protective Equipment Requirements correctly. Both staff persons were wearing their mask over their mouth only.

Staff reported during interview that she would have a talk with the staff about how to wear Personal Protective Equipment Requirements correctly.

This deficiency was cited due to the following E-Reg: 922 KAR 2:400E

Section 7. Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Requirements. (1) Each adult, including parents and guardians at drop-off and pick-up, shall wear a facemask while inside a child care center: (a) Unless doing so would represent a serious risk to their health or safety and they are able to present a medical statement stating this; (b) Except during planned staff breaks and lunch away from children in care and other staff.
