General: Based on observation, it was determined a six (6) month old child was sleeping on the floor when the surveyor entered the room. The child was lying on a small pillow on the floor. The teacher was feeding another child while the surveyor was in the room. The director who had entered the room with the surveyor picked the child up from the floor and held the child in her arms until the surveyor was ready to leave the room. The director stated the child, "had just fallen asleep". It was also determined that four (4) of the crib sheets in use in the infant room were stained and dirty. The sheets contained black and brown stains. The teacher stated the sheets were going to be washed that afternoon
