Findings:

General: Based on observation, review of documentation and interview, the family child care home failed to comply with regulatory requirements regarding animals. Observation of the child care home revealed a dog. Review of the rabies certificate for the aforementioned dog revealed it expired 9/21/18. Interview with the provider revealed the rabies certificate had expired.
