General: Based on observation, a mat was at the end of a multicolored slide and no protective surface was around the perimeter of the equipment in the two-year-olds' outdoor play area. A mat was at the end of a Little Tikes Tree House slide and a Step Two slide and no protective surface was around the perimeter of the equipment in the one-year-olds' outdoor play area. A Step Two Slide was placed on the sidewalk in the one-year-olds' outdoor play area.

General: Based on observation, a sheet was loose on a crib mattress in the nursery.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, rust was on the chain links of two (2) swings in the older children's outdoor play area. A foot pedal was missing from a five-cycle merry-go-round in the older children's outdoor play area. Rust was on the top and bottom inside walls of a microwave located in the kitchen. A one and a half (1 ½) inch tear, which exposed foam, was on the armrest of a blue vinyl chair in the two-year-olds' room #2.
