- (1) In accordance with 45 C.F.R. 98.43(b)(3), a prospective child care staff member who resides in or has resided in another state within the last five (5) years shall:
- (a) Request from each state of current or prior residency, in accordance with the state's laws, policies, and procedures, with a courtesy notice to the cabinet:
 - 1. An in-state criminal records check by:
 - a. Means of fingerprints for the state of residence; or
 - b. Any means accepted by a state of prior residency;
- 2. A check of the state's sex offender registry or repository; and
- 3. A check of the state-based child abuse and neglect registry and database; and
- (b) Direct results of the checks required in paragraph (a) of this subsection to the Department for Community Based Services, Division of Child Care, 275 East Main Street, 3C-F, Frankfort, Kentucky 40601.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 8/5/19, had an Indiana criminal records check dated 8/11/20 that indicated the search was inconclusive. It was stated on the document that the caregiver needed to obtain a criminal record COVID-19 response review challenge to complete the process; however, the caregiver failed to do so.

85 - Employment Status Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:280. Section 11. Status of Employment.

(1) A child care provider shall maintain the employment or residential status of each child care staff member who has submitted to a fingerprint-based criminal background check by reporting the status using the NBCP Web-based system.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver rehired on 4/1/21, was listed under separated employees on the KARES Report; therefore, the caregiver's employment status was not maintained.

General: Based on review of documentation, the center failed to assure compliance to 922 KAR 2:415E. A caregiver hired on 1/26/21, did not have a name-based child abuse/neglect check on file. In addition, the caregiver's name-based criminal records check, dated 6/3/21, was not submitted timely.

Findings:

General: Based on interview and review of documentation, a caregiver's criminal records check from Indiana was altered. White out covered the words "Inconclusive results fingerprints" at the top of the document. An interview with the owner determined she observed the white out on the document but had no knowledge of who altered the document. An interview with Indiana State Police determined the document was computer generated and was not released containing a white out substance.

General: Based on review of documentation, a caregiver hired on 5/3/21, did not have education verification on file.

General: Based on observation, the hot water temperature registered one hundred twenty-five (125) degrees Fahrenheit at two (2) sinks in the infants' room.

Findings

General: Based on observation, a foot gap was present between two (2) disconnected wooden landscape timbers, which exposed two (2) sharp edges, in the preschool outdoor play area

755 - Protective Surface Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (21) A protective surface shall:
- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:
- 1. Climb:
- 2. Swing; and
- 3. Slide; and
- (b) Have a fall zone equal to the height of the equipment.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a blue and yellow slide and a multicolor Step 2 double slide each had a thin layer of mulch at the end of the slide in the preschool outdoor play area. Also, a Step 2 slide was sixteen (16) inches tall and the protective surface extended out nine (9) inches on one (1) side of the slide in the toddlers' outdoor play area.

770 - Play Equipment Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (24) Supports for climbing apparatus and large equipment shall be securely fastened to the ground.
- (25) Crawl spaces, such as tunnels, shall be short and wide enough to permit access by adults.

- (a) Constructed to allow for drainage;
- (b) Covered when not in use;
- (c) Kept clean; and
- (d) Checked for vermin prior to use.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a sandbox was not in use and was uncovered in the preschool outdoor play area.

790 - Crib/Mattress/Sheet Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 6. Sleeping and Napping Requirements.

- (3) Rest time shall include adequate space specified by the child's age as follows:
- (a) For an infant:
- 1. An individual non-tiered crib that meets Consumer Product Safety Commission standards established in 16 C.F.R. 1219-1220;
- 2. A firm crib mattress in good repair with a clean tight-fitted sheet that shall be changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, a blue sheet loosely fit a crib mattress in the infants' room. A white sheet was ill fitting and lifted up the four (4) corners of a crib mattress in the infants' room. Children slept on both mattresses.

820 - Indoor/Outdoor Equipment

- (2) Indoor and outdoor equipment shall:
- (a) Be clean, safe, and in good repair;

General: Based on observation, vinyl peeled on the surface of a black adult size office chair in the two-year-olds' room.

- d. The child's general health status and medical history including, if applicable:
- (i) Allergies:
- (ii) Restriction on the child's participation in activities with specific instructions from the child's parent or health professional; and
- (iii) Permission from the parent for third-party professional services in the child-care center;
- e. The name and phone number of each person to be contacted in an emergency involving or impacting the child;
- f. Authorization by the parent for the child-care center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, a child enrolled on 8/2/20, did not include a preferred hospital in the enrollment information. A child enrolled on 11/4/16, did not include a preferred hospital, name of physician, and the physician's contact number in the enrollment information. A child enrolled on 4/5/21, did not include a preferred hospital and the name of a person who was designated in writing to pickup the child in the enrollment information. A child enrolled on 6/8/21, did not include the physician's contact number and preferred hospital in the enrollment information. Two (2) children each enrolled on 4/5/21, did not have the name of a person who was designated in writing to pickup the child in the enrollment information. Also, a child enrolled on 11/4/16, did not include authorization from a parent for the center to seek emergency medical care for the child in the parent's absence.

General: Based on observation, the center's statement of deficiency and plan of correction for the current licensure year were not posted.
