#### **General Administration**

225 - Licensee Responsibility Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 8. General.

- (1) A licensee shall:
- (a) Be responsible for the operation of the child-care center pursuant to this administrative regulation, 922 KAR 2:120, and 922 KAR 2:280; and
- (b) Protect and assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A dust pan placed on the sink in the School Age Classroom located in a separate building.
- 2. A small refrigerator located on a small table that was shaky and did not appear secure in the School Age Classroom that was located in a separate building.
- 3. Several items stored on a small shelf in the restroom in the School Age Classroom that was located in a separate building. The shelf was observed to be shaky and did not appear to be secure.
- 4. Two (2) totes stacked on top of each other on a brown kid sized shelf with bolts/screws placed on top of the totes in the School Age Classroom located inside a separate building.
- 5. One (1) large maroon outdoor umbrella placed on a brown shelf with the pole extending out from the shelf in the School Age Classroom located inside a separate building.
- 6. A piece of white wood with an exposed nail placed on top of a tote on a table in the School Age Classroom located inside a separate building.
- 7. A loose exposed cord plugged into an outlet by a stationary toy in the Infant Classroom.
- 8. A loose cord dangling down the wall from a wall mounted television in the One Year Old Classroom.
- 9. A loose cord dangling down the wall from a wall mounted television and plugged into a power strip that was placed on a brown shelf in the Two Year Old Classroom.
- 10. An electrical outlet that was missing one (1) outlet cover located beside a rocking chair in the Two Year Old Classroom.
- 11. The exposed flat ends of nails sticking out from the side a cabinet in the restroom located in the Two Year Old Classroom.
- 12. A white small refrigerator placed on top of a red child sized table that appeared to not be secured in the Two Year Old Classroom.
- 13. Toys stored on a white shelf that was shaky and appeared not secured in the Two Year Old Classroom.
- 14. A white piece of board that was chipped and placed underneath the diaper changing pad table in a cabinet that was unlocked in the Toddler Classroom.
- 15. A loose cord dangling down from a television in the Preschool Classroom.
- 16. A sharp end of a nail sticking through the side of the sink cabinet located beside the diaper changing pad table in the Preschool Classroom.
- 17. A tall black mini refrigerator placed on top of a small white table and appeared to not be secured in the Preschool Classroom.
- 18. An exposed power strip placed on the wall above a small brown shelf/table in the Preschool Classroom.
- 19. An electrical outlet missing one (1) outlet cover located near child sized tables in the Preschool Classroom.
- 20. An unlocked gray cabinet in the Preschool Classroom that contained bottles of hand sanitizer and disinfectant spray.
- 21. An umbrella placed beside the toilet in the restroom located beside the entrance door.

360 - Staff Evaluation Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall
- (j) Assess each staff person's interaction with children in care and classroom performance through an annual written performance evaluation;

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that the following staff (DOH: 04/17/19, 05/10/19, 04/05/18 and 06/13/19) files contained a written performance evaluation that was dated for 08/10/20; therefore, the evaluations were not completed annually.

Through interview with staff-in-charge, the surveyor learned that up-to-date annual written performance evaluations were not available for review for the staff mentioned.

405 - TB Verification Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (1) Child-care center staff:
- (b) Shall provide, prior to employment and every two (2) years thereafter:
- 1. A statement from a health professional that the individual is free of active tuberculosis; or
- 2. A copy of negative tuberculin results.

### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found that a staff's (DOH: 04/17/19) file did not contain documentation of a current TB skin test or a statement from a health professional stating that the adult was free from active tuberculosis. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the staff person has not had an up-to-date TB skin test.



435 - Training Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

#### Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A staff (DOH: 06/01/13) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 03/29/16; therefore, the training was not completed within the last five years.
- 2. A staff (DOH: 05/16/15) completed one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training on 02/25/16; therefore, the training was not completed within the last five years.
- 3. A staff's (DOH: 05/10/19) file did not contain documentation of one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; therefore, the training was not completed within one (1) year of employment.
- 4. A staff's (DOH: 06/13/19) file did not contain documentation of one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; therefore, the training was not completed within one (1) year of employment.
- 5. The following staff (DOH: 05/16/15, 04/17/19, and 04/05/18) obtained zero (0) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training for the review period 07/01/20 06/30/21.
- 6. A staff (DOH: 05/10/19) obtained thirteen (13) hours of the required fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training for the review period 07/01/20 06/30/21.

### 525 - Infant/Toddler Combined with Older Children

922 KAR 2:120. Section 5. Infant and Toddler Play Requirements.

- (3) Except in accordance with subsection (4) of this section or Section 2(2)(c) of this administrative regulation, an infant or toddler under twenty-four (24) months of age shall not participate in an activity with an older child for no more than one (1) hour per day.
- (4) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group; and
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one (1) two-year-old child to be in the Preschool Classroom with three-year-old through five-year-old children. During interview, staff-in-charge stated that the two-year-old child had been in quarantine due to COVID and just came back to the child-care center. Staff-in-charge stated that the two-year-old child did not have a transition plan on file. The surveyor observed the children to be grouped together for the duration of the survey which was from approximately 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.



#### Premises

585 - Premises Requirements Not In Compliance

### 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (1) The premises shall be:
- (a) Suitable for the purpose intended;
- (b) Kept clean and in good repair;

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. What appeared to be a gray foam circle that contained stains in the Infant Classroom; therefore, the foam was not kept clean.
- 2. A black rug that contained debris located by the sink in the Infant Classroom; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 3. An exposed hole in the drywall around a white line extending from the toilet in the restroom located in the hallway.
- 4. What appeared to be paint inside the sink in the restroom located in the hallway; therefore, the sink was not kept clean.
- 5. An odor observed in the restroom located in the hallway. Staff-in-charge stated that the odor was due to the galvanized pipes within the child-care center.
- 6. A garbage can that contained rust in the One Year Old Classroom; therefore, the garbage can was not kept clean or in good repair.
- 7. The sink and faucet contained what appeared to be paint stains in the One Year Old Classroom; therefore, the sink was not kept clean.
- 8. A round blue rug that contained debris in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 9. A rocking chair with blue cushions that contained stains and tears located in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the rocking chair was not kept clean or in good repair.
- 10. A garbage can that contained rust in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the garbage can was not kept clean or good repair.
- 11. Stuffed animals placed on what appeared to be gray carpet that contained stains in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the carpet was not kept clean.
- 12. A black/white rug that contained stains and debris in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 13. A blue round rug that contained debris in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 14. What appeared to be paint stains inside the sink in the restroom located beside the front entrance door; therefore, the sink was not kept clean.
- 15. A gray square rug that contained stains in the School Age Classroom located inside the main building; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 16. A purple rug that contained debris in the School Age Classroom located inside the main building; therefore, the rug was not kept clean.
- 17. A brown mat on a gray rug with stuff animals placed on top of it that appeared to contain stains in the School Age Classroom located inside the main building; therefore, the mat was not kept clean.

### 625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings

### 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. What appeared to be drywall chipping around and above a pipe located on the floor beside the toilet in the restroom in the hallway exposing a brown color underneath; therefore, the drywall was not kept in good repair. Staff-in-charge stated that the pipe was a galvanized pipe and they have had the lines/pipes checked. Staff-in-charge stated that she would have the drywall repaired.
- 2. Small holes in the drywall going up the wall to the ceiling in the restroom in the School Age Classroom that was located inside a separate building; therefore, the drywall was not kept in good repair.

### 695 - Toilet

#### 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. The toilet seat moved easily and was not tightly secured to the toilet in the restroom located in the Two Year Old Classroom; therefore, the toilet was not kept in good repair.
- 2. The toilet seat moved easily and was not tightly secured to the toilet in the restroom in the School Age Classroom located inside a separate building; therefore, the toilet was not kept in good repair.
- 3. The toilet bowl contained stains in the restroom located beside the front entrance; therefore, the toilet was not kept in clean condition.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Debris on the diaper changing table underneath the diaper changing pad in the One Year Old Classroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.
- 2. What appeared to be blue paint stains in the diaper changing pad in the Toddler Classroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.
- 3. Debris on the diaper changing pad and table underneath the diaper changing pad in the Preschool Classroom; therefore, the diaper changing surface was not kept clean.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A large nail protruding out from the side of a wooden border that borders the playground equipment on the School Age Playground by a blue dome shaped structure.
- 2. A picnic table that was broken on top and contained a sharp edge on the Infant Playground.
- 3. A stationary riding toy that contained a broken/chipped piece located by the swings on the Infant Playground.
- 4. A screw protruding out from a metal pole on the Infant Playground.
- 5. What appeared to be green stepping cups that had long strings attached to them placed on the ground on the Infant Playground.
- 6. A small umbrella with a pole stuck in the fence roll on the Two Year Old Playground.
- 7. A pink picnic table that contained a broken/cracked piece on the Two Year Old Playground.
- 8. A large piece of concrete with a metal pole placed in the center of the concrete located on the Two Year Old Playground.
- 9. Five (5) plastic kitchen playsets filled with water and debris on the Preschool Playground.
- 10. A stainless steel garbage can that contained a broken lid on the Preschool Playground.
- 11. An open and exposed vent hole located on the side of the building beside a red picnic table on the Preschool Playground.
- 12. A small tricycle missing one (1) black rubber handle bar grip on the Preschool Playground.
- 13. What appeared to be a sand box on the Preschool Playground that was filled with water.

- (a) Be provided for outdoor play equipment used to:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found mats placed underneath four (4) swings on the Preschool Playground located beside the parking lot that did not have an adequate fall zone.



805 - Fence Construction Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

- (24) Fences shall be:
- (a) Constructed of safe material;
- (b) Stable; and
- (c) In good condition.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. Weeds and brush in the fence roll along part of the back and sides of the School Age Playground.
- 2. Weeds in the corner and side fence roll on the Infant Playground.
- 3. A gap where the fence meets the building on the Infant Playground. The surveyor observed a wooden board wrapped in what appeared to be wire placed in the gap that contained sharp edges.

General: Based on review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

- 1. A child's (DOE: 04/05/12) file did not contain the contact telephone number for the child's preferred hospital or family physician.
- 2. A child's (DOE: 09/20/20) file did not contain the name of the child's preferred hospital or contact telephone number.
