General: Based on Observation and interview, a caregiver supervised, for ten (10) minutes, nineteen (19) children, aged three to four years old, in the pre-k room.

General: Based on Observation and interview, nineteen children were supervised by a caregiver in the pre-k room. The age of the youngest child was three-years old.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a staff, hired on 02/16/17, did not have TB documentation on file.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 $\frac{1}{2}$) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and

General: Based on Review of Documentation, a staff, hired on 01/04/16, completed six (6) hours of cabinet approved training during the first year of employment. A staff, hired on 03/07/16, had not completed pediatric abusive head trauma training within the first year of employment.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a one year old child was grouped together with seven (7), two year old children for three (3) hours in the two year olds' room.

Premises Not In Compliance

460 - Inaccessible Items Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) Except in accordance with subsection (8) of this section, the following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Knives and sharp objects;
- (c) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids;
- (d) Plastic bags;
- (e) Litter and rubbish;
- (f) Bar soap; and
- (g) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a caregiver's purse was stored on top of a three (3) foot high wooden shelf in the pre-k room. A caregiver's purse was stored on top of a two (2) foot high shelf and a caregiver's jacket hung on the wall in the two year olds' room. A caregiver's laptop, laptop cord and keys were stored on a two (2) foot high wooden shelf in the three year olds' room. Two (2) plastic bags were stored in an unlocked compartment under the sink in the restroom adjacent to the two year olds' room. These items were accessible to children.

585 - Sink Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 10. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (3) A sink shall be:
- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, the hot water temperature registered eight-four (84) degrees Fahrenheit at two (2) sinks in the restroom adjacent to the infants' room.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a caregiver did not wash her hands with liquid soap and warm running water after diapering a child in the infants' room.

625 - Diaper Changing Area/Surface

- (10) When a child is diapered, the child shall:
 - (b) Be placed on a surface that is:
 - 1. Clean;
 - 2. Padded:

 - 4. Nonabsorbent;
 - 5. Easily cleaned; and
 - 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, a tear was in the diapering mat at the diapering station in the restroom adjacent to the two year olds' room.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and

- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the expiration date on the bottle has passed.

Findings

General: Based on Observation, a four (4) ounce tube of calmoseptine ointment was stored unlocked in a child's cubby in the two year olds' room. A two (2) ounce bottle of pedicare fever reducer was stored in an unlocked cabinet in the two year olds' room. A four (4) ounce bottle of a prescribed decongestant, antihistamine, and cough suppressant was stored unlocked in a child's cubby in the three year olds' room. A six (6) ounce tube of Desitin diaper rash cream was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged in the one year olds' room. In addition, the six (6) ounce tube of Desitin diaper rash cream, an ounce tube of hydrocortisone ointment, a bottle of Meijer infant's ibuprofen, and an albuterol sulfate inhaler were each stored unlocked in a plastic container in children's cubbies in the one year olds' room. A bottle of children's decongestant, antihistamine, and cough suppressant, a bottle of children's ibuprofen, and a bottle of Equate KIDS sunscreen, were each stored unlocked in children's cubbies in the one year olds' room. A sixteen (16) ounce jar of Boudreaux's butt past was not labeled to indicate to whom it belonged and was stored unlocked under the diapering station in the restroom adjacent to the two year olds' room. Two (2), two (2) ounce tubes of Desitin diaper rash cream and a four (4) ounce tube of Boudreaux's butt paste was stored in an unlocked box next to the diapering station in the one year olds' restroom.

- 2. Bedding that is in good repair and is changed:
- a. Weekly; or
- b. Immediately if it is soiled or wet.

Findings:

General: Based on Observation, seven (7) red nap mats, stored on a cart, were torn and had exposed foam. These mats were in the hallway.
