General: Based on Observation, it was found that two (2) employees were supervising forty (40) children ages five to eleven (5-11)years old from 2:50 p.m. to 3:10 p.m. At 3:10 p.m. a third staff person arrived, thus correcting the ratio issue. The group remained over maximum group size until 4:05 p.m.

- (1) Effective with the adoption of this administrative regulation, a director shall:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for two (2) eligible employees did not contain evidence of an annual evaluation being completed.

  - (b) May be employed or work with a child on a probationary basis for up to ninety (90) calendar days, pending completion of a:
  - 1. Child abuse or neglect check using the central registry in accordance with 922 KAR 1:470;
  - 2. Criminal records check required by KRS 199.896(19);
  - 3. Criminal records check for any previous state of residence if the person resided outside the state of Kentucky in the last five (5) years; and
  - 4. An address check of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- (c) Not be left alone in the presence of a child until copies of the background checks in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection have been received by the licensee.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the files for employees hired on 10-21-16 and 11-2-16 did not contain evidence of submission for or the results of criminal records checks, central registry checks and out of state background checks. The employee hired on 10-21-16 lived in Ohio within the last five (5) years. The employee hired on 11-2-16 lived in Indiana within the last five (5) years. Neither of these employees were observed to be working alone with children.

- 6. For a director, employee, volunteer, or any person with supervisory or disciplinary control over, or having unsupervised contact with, a child in care, the results of a:

# Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file for an employee hired on 8-29-17 contained evidence of a TB skin test that was read on 9-1-17. This date is not prior to the date of hire as required.

#### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 5. Staff Requirements.

- (14) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following:
  - (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;
- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment, including one and one-half (1 1/2) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training; and
- (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training during each subsequent year of employment, including one and onehalf (1 ½) hours of pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that the file and ECE-TRIS record for an employee hired on 8-9-13 did not contain evidence of Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training being completed. The ECE-TRIS record and file for this employee also contained evidence of only ten (10) hours of training being completed during the last completed training year. The ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 8-15-16 did not contain evidence of the six-hour orientation training being completed. ECE-TRIS and the file also contained evidence of only five (5) hours of additional training being completed during the last completed training year. The ECE-TRIS record and file for an employee hired on 11-2-16 did not contain evidence of the six-hour orientation training being completed.

General: Based on Review of Documentation, it was found that nine (9) out of ten (10) children's records reviewed did not contain authorization for emergency medical care.

General: Based on Observation, it was found that the statement of deficiencies issued and the plan of correction submitted for the relicensure survey conducted in 2016 was not posted in the facility.
