### 115 - Reports to Cabinet

### 922 KAR 2:110. Section 6. Reports.

(1) The following shall be reported to the cabinet or designee and other agencies specified in this section within twenty-four (24) hours from the time of discovery:

- (a) Communicable disease, which shall also be reported to the local health department pursuant to KRS 214.010;
- (b) An accident or injury to a child that requires medical care;
- (c) An incident that results in legal action by or against the child-care center that:
- 1. Affects a child or staff person; or
- 2. Includes the center's discontinuation or disqualification from a governmental assistance program due to fraud or abuse;

(d) An incident involving fire or other emergency, including a vehicular accident when the center is transporting a child receiving child care

services; or

(e) A report of child abuse or neglect that:

1. Has been accepted by the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 1:330; and

2. Names a director, employee, volunteer, or person with supervisory or disciplinary control over, or having unsupervised contact with a child in care as the alleged perpetrator.

#### Findings:

General: Based on Review of Documentation, the facility failed to meet this regulatory requirement. Written documentation received in the DRCC office from the staff person in charge at the facility stated that an eight (8) year old child hit her arm on a fire extinguisher box on 2/25/15 at 4:45PM and fractured her left arm/wrist. The written documentation further indicated that the child's mother picked the child up after the incident to seek medical attention. However, the incident was not reported to the DRCC office until 2/27/15.

(b) Infant and child first aid.

(4) For a child-care center licensed for school-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently

certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

(a) Adult cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and

(b) First aid.
