General: Based on review of documentation, there was documentation of only one staff meeting being conducted during the current licensure year presented at the time of the survey

Findings:

General: Based on observation upon entering the Infant classroom at 10:14 a.m., there was a three-month-old child asleep in a swing with a bottle in his mouth. At 10:33 a.m. the child was still observed sleeping in the swing. There had been no attempt to move the child to a crib during that time.

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1. Staff person hired 9/313 did not have documentation of negative T.B. results on file in the facility that had been obtained within the past two (2) years. The previous T.B. results were dated 11/29/16
- 2. Staff person hired 7/20/16 did not have documentation of negative T.B. results on file in the facility that had been obtained within the past two (2) years. The previous T.B. results were dated 10/14/16.

400 - CPR/First Aid Coverage Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:090. Section 11. Staff Requirements.

- (3) For a child-care center licensed for infant, toddler, or preschool-age children, at least one (1) person on duty and present with the children shall be currently certified by a cabinet-approved training agency in the following skills:

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the staff person transporting children on the day of the survey did not have documentation of current CPR/First Aid verification on file at the facility. It was determined that the staff person transports the children alone.

- (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation within the first three (3) months of employment;

Findings:

General: Based on review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1. Saff person hired 9/3/13 did not have evidence of completing the Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma training within the past five (5) years. The certificate on file was dated 2/26/13.
- 2. Staff person hired on 2/15/15 did not have documentation of any hours of annual training during the last full year of employment.
- 3. Staff person hired on 9/3/13 had documentation of only thirteen (13) hours of annual training during the last full year of employment.

- (3) If a toddler is developmentally appropriate for a transition to a preschool age group, a toddler may participate in an activity with an older child for more than one (1) hour per day if:
- (a) Space for the toddler is available in the preschool-age group;
- (b) The staff-to-child ratios and group sizes are maintained based on the age of the youngest child;
- (c) The center has a procedure for listing a transitioning toddler on attendance records, including a specific day and time the toddler is with either age group; and
- (d) The child care center has obtained the signature and approval of the toddler's parent on the toddler's transition plan.

Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, there were nine (9) children ranging in age from two to three (2 - 3) years being cared for in the Twos classroom. In an interview with staff it was found that the children are grouped together the entire time they are present in the facility. In an interview with the Director it was determined that the facility did not have a procedure for transitioning toddlers or signed approval from the toddlers' parents on a transition plan.



495 - Bedding/Toys in Crib Not In Compliance

General: Based on observation, the six (6) cribs in the Infant classroom had loose-fitting sheets. The cribs were being used for napping infants throughout the day.

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1. There were two (2) staff purses being stored on the floor by the teacher's desk in the Twos classroom. The purses were accessible to the children in care.
- 2. There was a bottle of correction fluid being stored in a lower drawer in the teacher's desk in the Preschool classroom. The fluid was accessible to the children in care.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1. The vents in the two (2) bathrooms in the hallway had an accumulation of dust and dirt.
- 2. The carpet on the floor in the Preschool classroom had an accumulation of dirty tape residue, crumbs and art media scraps.
- 2. The carpet in the Twos classroom had several tears and an accumulation of dirty tape residue.
- 3. There was an abundance or crayon/marker marks on the walls and most of the furniture in the Two's classroom.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the staff person in the Infant classroom changed a child's diaper and did not wash her hands afterwards.



First Aid/Medication

730 - Medication Not In Compliance

922 KAR 2:120. Section 7. First Aid and Medicine.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
 - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 12(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was a large bottle of Ibuprophen and a large bottle of Tums located on a shelf in the Director's office. The medication was not in a locked area of the facility.
