General: Based on observation, there was one protective outlet cover missing on the outlet that was right above the small, floor sized refrigerator located in the Infant classroom.

- (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one
- and one-half (1  $rac{1}{2}$ ) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each
- subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years.
- (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, one staff hired on 10/24/18, had only eleven (11) hours of cabinet approved training on file from July 1,2020 to June 30, 2021. This information was verified through ECE-TRIS.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1) There were several areas of peeling paint on the ceiling in the preschool classroom.
- 2) There was a section of black baseboard that had come unglued in the infant classroom.
- 3) There was a large section of chipping paint on a wall in the two-year-old classroom.

- 5. Easily cleaned; and
- 6. Free of any items not used for diaper changing.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the diaper changing pads in the infant classroom and two-year-old classroom were found to be very dirty and dingy.

- (6) Medication, including refrigerated medication, shall be:
- (a) Stored in a separate and locked place, out of the reach of a child unless the medication is:
- 1. A first aid supply and is maintained in accordance with subsection (1) of this section;
- 2. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste. Diaper cream, sunscreen, or toothpaste shall be inaccessible to a child;
- 3. An epinephrine auto-injector. A licensed child-care center shall comply with KRS 199.8951 and 311.646, including:
- a. An epinephrine auto-injector shall be inaccessible to a child;
- b. A child-care center shall have at least one (1) person onsite who has received training on the administration of an epinephrine auto-injector if the child-care center maintains an epinephrine auto-injector;
  - c. A child-care center shall seek emergency medical care for a child if an auto-injector is administered to the child; and
- d. A child-care center shall report to the child's parent and the cabinet in accordance with 922 KAR 2:090, Section 13(1)(b) if an epinephrine auto-injector is administered to a child; or
- 4. An emergency or rescue medication for a child in care, such as medication to respond to diabetic or asthmatic condition, as prescribed by the child's physician. Emergency or rescue medication shall be inaccessible to a child in care;
- (b) Kept in the original bottle; and
- (c) Properly labeled.
- (7) Medication shall not be given to a child if the medication's expiration date has passed.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, there was a large unlocked grey cabinet in the preschool classroom which housed an unlocked medication box. Inside the box the surveyor found a bottle of children's ibuprofen. This medication was accessible to the children.
