#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) There was one uncovered outlet located within the Infant classroom.
- 2.) A wall of blocks was stacked approximately ten-foot-high against a wall within the indoor gross motor space. The heavy stack of blocks presented a tipping hazard.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

#### Findings:

565 - Inaccessible Items

General: Based on observation, a storage bin containing cleaning supplies was placed on a low shelf in the facility lobby. The chemicals were labeled, "Keep out of reach of children." These items were accessible to the children in care.

#### 605 - Building Requirements

- 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.
- (5) The building shall be constructed to ensure the:
- (a) Building is:
- 1. Dry;
- 2. Ventilated; and
- 3. Well lit, including clean light fixtures that are:
- a. In good repair in all areas; and
- b. Shielded or have shatter-proof bulbs installed; and
- (b) Following are protected:
- 1. Windows;
- 2. Doors;
- 3. Stoves;
- 4. Heaters;
- 5. Furnaces;
- 6. Pipes; and
- 7. Stairs.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, a light fixture within the restroom area located near the Indoor gross motor space contained dead bugs; therefore, this fixture was not clean. This deficiency was cited during the 2020 inspection process.

### 625 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:120. Section 4. Premises Requirements.

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) A segment of baseboard was separating from the wall in Classroom 11 and in the indoor gross motor space.
- 2.) Classroom 11, the Infant classroom, and the back hallway had several areas of chipping paint and exposed drywall.
- 3.) Water stained ceiling tiles were present in Classroom 11, Classroom 12, and the restroom near facility back exit.
- 4.) Several soap dispensers, hand sanitizer dispensers, and paper towel dispensers were mounted on unfinished walls within the facility. The area behind the mounted dispensers was chalking and not smooth. This deficiency was cited during the 2020 inspection year.
- 5.) The ceiling vents in the Older Two-year-old classroom bathroom were sheathed in dust. Additionally, the bathroom near the Indoor gross motor area had a dusty vent.
- 6.) A tennis ball sized hole was located on the back wall near the facility exit.
- 7.) An area of tile flooring in the Two-year-old classroom was broken, the corners of the tile flooring were chipping and cracking. Additionally, a portion of floor tile was chipped in the School-age space.
- 8.) A drop-down ceiling tile was missing from the School-age space.
- 9.) A portion of a green rug used within the indoor gross motor space, and a gray rug within the Older Two-year-old classroom had curling edges and presented a tripping hazard. Additionally, portion of the carpet edge was frayed within the indoor gross motor space.

### 695 - Toilet Not In Compliance

#### 922 KAR 2:120. Section 12. Toilet, Diapering, and Toiletry Requirements.

- (4) Each toilet shall:
- (a) Be kept in clean condition;
- (b) Be kept in good repair;
- (c) Be in a lighted room; and
- (d) Have ventilation to outside air.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the light bulbs in the Older Two-year-old classroom bathroom were not in working order.

- (1) First aid supplies shall:
- (a) Be available to provide prompt and proper first aid treatment;

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, medical tape was not available at the facility.

- (1) All toys and furniture contacted by a child shall be:
- (a) Kept clean and in good repair; and
- (b) Free of peeling, flaking, or chalking paint.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) Tape residue was observed on shelving used for play in Classroom 12. The tape residue had started to accumulate dirt and grime.
- 2.) A shelf in the indoor gross motor space was in disrepair, the particle board was chipping.
- 3.) The vinyl was ripped on the climbing pads in the Infant classroom, the foam was exposed.
- 4.) A cabinet door housing diapers in the Infant classroom had broken hinges, the door was not properly fixated onto the cabinet. Additionally, a cabinet housing a sink in the Schoolage classroom was in disrepair, the door was hanging loosely from the hinges.
- 5.) A toy bin was found in the sink basin of Classroom 13. The classroom was not currently in use. The toy bin was filled with water that had become murky and rotted.

- 2. Each service charged separately and in addition to the basic rate for child care;
- (f) Minimum staff-to-child ratios and group size established in 922 KAR 2:120; and
- (g) Daily planned program.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the facility license and statement of deficiency with corresponding plan of correction from the 2020 licensure year was not posted for public inspection.
