General: Based on review of documentation and ECE-TRIS, the following was found :

1. Staff with the following hire dates: 10/3/13, 9/02/14, 4/11/15, 9/1/15, 12/04/17, 9/19/18, 10/21/18, 11/12/18, and 11/26/18 did not complete fifteen hours of early care and education training.

Staff hired on 10/03/13 and 11/12/18, did not have evidence of completing Pediatric Abusive Head Trauma.

A staff person hired on 11/12/18 did not have evidence of completing the six-hour Orientation training.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation and interview, the surveyor found that staff failed to implement a daily planned program (lesson plans) and failed to ensure activities are developmentally appropriate.

1. The surveyor reviewed the daily planned program posted in Toddler C dated 12/16/18-1/17/19, and found the following activities listed: counting soft blocks, dress-up like mommy, and playing with puppets. The surveyor found no dress-up clothes, no puppets, and no blocks available. Furthermore, the surveyor noted that on 1/8/2020, the children were to color Christmas trees, but the surveyor observed "cat" ditto sheets. The staff person stated that she did not know why she wrote "Christmas tree" activity on the lesson plan when the holiday had already passed.

The surveyor observed a pretend kitchen unit in Toddler C, but found no dramatic play items such as pots/pans, dishes, and pretend food to use with the kitchen set. There were no additional dramatic play toys and no multi-cultural materials. The staff person stated the staff person in charge was planning on getting more materials and toys for the classroom.

2. The surveyor reviewed the daily planned program posted in Toddler A labeled January 2020. The surveyor noted very few activities listed on the lesson plan. The activities were: holding crayons, use fingers to turn pages, building blocks, dancing, clapping, coloring, ABC and bumblebee song, finger paint coloring. The lesson plan did not give any specific details as to what exactly the children would be doing each day. Based on interview, the surveyor found the activities were planned to be implemented every day for a month.

3. The surveyor reviewed the daily planned program posted in Preschool A labeled January 2020. The surveyor noted "TV" listed three times on the lesson plan. Based on review of the lesson plan, the surveyor could not determine if "TV" time on Fridays is educational. Based on interview, the surveyor found that the children watch television every Friday. The staff person stated that they watch "kiddie movies" such as Boss Baby. It is important to note that Boss Baby has a PG rating for mild rude humor and mild violence. The children enrolled in Preschool A are three-to-five vears old.

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the surveyor found the following:

The surveyor reviewed the daily planned program posted in Preschool A labeled January 2020. The surveyor observed "TV" listed three times on the lesson plan. Based on review of the lesson plan, the surveyor could not determine if "TV" time on Fridays is educational. Based on interview, the surveyor found that the children watch television every Friday. The staff stated that they watch "kiddie movies" such as Boss Baby. It is important to note that Boss Baby has a PG rating for mild rude humor and mild violence. The children enrolled in Preschool A are three-to-five years old.

2. A can of Hot Shot flying insect spray in the school-age classroom near the gaming area.

3. A staff person's purse on top of the children's cubbies across the hall from the restroom. The surveyor noted the strap of the purse hanging over the cubbies and within reach of the children in care. The surveyor noted this area of the classroom blocked with a gate; however, at approximately 10:20 a.m., the surveyor observed a staff person and two children walk through this area in order for the children to go to the restroom.

3. Areas of unraveled carpet in Preschool C.

4. Area rugs located in the two-year-old (older 2's) classroom, Toddler B classroom, and School-Age classroom, littered with debris and small particles.

5. A build-up of dirt and grime in front of the gaming area located in the school-age classroom.

6. An overwhelming odor of urine in the school-age boys' restroom.

7. Brown residue on the front of the orange colored school-age girls' restroom door.

8. An exhaust fan located in the school-age boys' restroom that appeared not secured to the ceiling.

9. Urine in the toilet located in the school-age girls' restroom.

10. Children's clothing strewn about the floor in front of cubbies located in the two-year-old classroom.

General: Based on observation, the surveyor found one overhead light fixture in a restroom that was not covered with a protective shield. The staff person in charge was not sure if the fluorescent light fixtures were shatterproof.

### Findings

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the surveyor found Preschool B and Toddler B over capacity.

The surveyor entered Preschool B at approximately 9:44 a.m. and observed two staff and twelve preschool children. At approximately 10:54 a.m., the surveyor observed two staff and fifteen preschool children. At approximately 10:55 a.m., the surveyor observed two staff and sixteen preschool children. A review of the facility's diagram found the classroom was measured for a capacity of eleven children. The surveyors re-measured the classroom and found the classroom to be 399 square feet. Therefore, the classroom was over capacity by five children.

The surveyor entered Toddler B at approximately 9:45 a.m. and again at approximately 10:14 a.m. and observed one staff and five toddlers. The surveyor noted the classroom appeared to be too crowded. A review of the diagram found the classroom was given a capacity of four children. The surveyors re-measured the classroom and found the classroom to be 150 square feet. Therefore, the classroom was over capacity by one child.

General: Based on observation, The surveyor found the following:

1. A section of peeled paint along the wall in Preschool C. Although the room was not in use during the inspection, a staff person stated that they were planning to utilize the classroom soon.

2. An area of peeled paint, one small hole, and five protruding screws in the wall located in the two-year-old room (older 2's). Additionally, the surveyor observed a section of peeled paint along the baseboard.

3. A section of rough paint/dry wall patchwork on the wall in the school-age room behind the gaming area. Additionally, the surveyor observed rough dry wall patchwork and dry wall tape peeling on the half-wall posts.
