(3)(a) Each center shall maintain a child-care program that assures each child will be:

- 1. Provided with adequate supervision at all times by a qualified staff person who ensures the child is:
- a. Within scope of vision and range of voice; or
- b. For a school-age child, within scope of vision or range of voice;

Findings:

General: Based on observation, it was found that this regulatory requirement was not met. The surveyor entered the lunch/before and after school area in the facility at approximately 9:40AM. In this room, there is an area that is sectioned off and contained different toys and equipment for infants. During this initial walkthrough, there were five infants and one teacher in the infant play area. After a short conversation with the staff in this area, a tour of the facility was conducted. Upon the surveyor's return to the area, there were six infants, two staff members, and the director. The additional teacher came from the kitchen area and the director had just arrived from purchasing groceries for the center. When asked where the additional infant came from, it was reported that the child had been in the infant classroom sleeping in the first crib. It was also stated that the infants get bored in their classroom, so that is why the additional play area was set up.

It could not be determined how long the child was alone and asleep in the infant classroom prior to and during the walkthrough performed initially by the surveyor. The child was not within scope of vision of any staff member and most likely could not be heard unless the child was making a loud noise or crying.

922 KAR 2:090. Section 10. Director Requirements and Responsibilities.

- (1) A director shall:
- (I) Assure the health, safety, and comfort of each child;

Findings:

General: Based on observation and review of documentation, the following was found:

- 1.) When the surveyor first entered the facility before being let into the actual childcare space, it was observed that the teacher who was with the infants was using her cell phone. The staff member was observed to have her head down and once the staff member got up she carried the cell phone with her. The staff member laid her cell phone down on one of the tables in the lunch area while she was getting another staff member.
- 2.) It was found that a five-month-old child was left unsupervised in the infant classroom for an undetermined amount of time (see tag 90 for full deficiency). This child's file was pulled for review and it was indicated on the child's enrollment paperwork that the child had acid reflux. This poses a risk to the child's safety as children with this condition often have digestion issues during or after being fed. Due to the child being unsupervised, no staff member would have known if the child was having any kind of complication due to this condition.

922 KAR 2:120. Section 3. General Requirements.

- (7) The following shall be inaccessible to a child in care:
- (a) Toxic cleaning supplies, poisons, and insecticides;
- (b) Matches, cigarettes, lighters, and flammable liquids; and
- (c) Personal belongings and medications of staff.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) There was a container of Clorox wipes sitting on top of a shelf in the indoor gross motor room. These wipes were within reach of the children in care.
- 2.) It was found that the kitchen door was propped open during the inspection. The kitchen had cleaners and rolls of trash bags being stored. Due to the door being open and having no kind of barrier, these items were accessible to the children in care.
- 3.) There was a storage closet located beside the kitchen; this closet was unlocked and contained cleaners and trash bags.
- 4.) In the two-year-old classroom, the staff members' purses were sitting on the floor of an unlocked closet.

580 - Floors, Walls, Ceilings Not In Compliance

(9) Floors, walls, and ceilings shall be smooth, in good repair, and constructed to be easily cleaned.

Findings

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) In the infant classroom, there was missing paint on the wall located by the table in the room.
- 2.) In the preschool classroom, there were areas of missing and chipped paint on the walls. Also, in the preschool classroom, there were pop-tarts crumbs on the floor by the back door in the room.
- 3.) In the indoor gross motor classroom, there was a wall that was in disrepair. The wall appeared as if there were areas that were denting in and had missing paint in certain areas.

General: Based on observation, it was found that there were crib sheets in the infant classroom that were dirty and soiled.

Findings:

General: Based on observation, the following was found:

- 1.) In the infant classroom, there was a vinyl climbing toy. This toy was ripping along the edges and could no longer be properly sanitized.
- 2.) In the indoor gross motor room, there was a table that contained an excessive amount of crayon/pen marks, as well as some stickers and sticker residue.

General: Based on review of documentation, it was found that one child's file did not have a preferred hospital listed on the enrollment paperwork. The enrollment information read "N/A" on the paperwork.
