Findings: General: Based on observation, there was a tall stack of chairs in the preschool and two-year-old rooms, which is a safety hazard to the children as the chairs could tip over. In Compliance **Director Requirements Employee Records** Not In Compliance 435 - Training Not In Compliance 922 KAR 2:090, Section 11, Staff Requirements, (16) In accordance with KRS 199.896(15) and (16), a staff person with supervisory authority over a child shall complete the following: (a) Six (6) hours of cabinet-approved orientation completed within the first three (3) months of employment in a child-care program; (b) Nine (9) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training within the first year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training; and (c) Fifteen (15) hours of cabinet-approved early care and education training completed between July 1 and the following June 30 of each subsequent year of employment in a child care program, including one and one-half (1 ½) hours of cabinet-approved pediatric abusive head trauma training completed once every five (5) years. (17) A staff person's compliance with training requirements of this section shall be verified through the cabinet-designated database maintained pursuant to 922 KAR 2:240. Findings: General: Based on review of documentation, one staff hired on 01/05/15, did not complete the required 15 hours of annual training between 07/01/2020 and 06/30/2021. A review of ECE-TRIS confirmed this finding.

### Findings:

General: Based on observation, three cribs had mobiles attached to them which is considered a toy. The regulation states no toys or other items except for the infant's pacifier in the specified space. Premises

#### (3) A sink shall be:

- (a) Located in or immediately adjacent to toilet rooms;
- (b) Equipped with hot and cold running water that allows for hand washing;
- (c) Equipped with hot water at a minimum temperature of ninety (90) degrees Fahrenheit and a maximum of 120 degrees Fahrenheit;
- (d) Equipped with liquid soap;
- (e) Equipped with hand-drying blower or single use disposable hand drying material;
- (f) Equipped with an easily cleanable waste receptacle; and
- (g) Immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, in the two-year-old room, the changing table was located on the opposite side of the room, farthest away from the sink. The regulation states that a sink shall be immediately adjacent to a changing area used for infants and toddlers. After toileting and/or diapering, a staff or child should be able to move directly to the sink for hand washing without touching anything.

- (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, wash his or her hands with liquid soap and warm running water:
- 1. a. Upon arrival at the center; or
- b. Within thirty (30) minutes of arrival for school-age children;
- 2. Before and after eating or handling food;
- 3. After toileting or diaper change;
- 4. After handling animals:
- 5. After touching an item or an area of the body soiled with body fluids or wastes; and
- 6. After outdoor or indoor play time; and

(c) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (b) of this subsection. The child shall wash the child's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, several children were getting their diapers changed while in the two-year-old classroom and their hands were not washed afterwards. The regulation states that a child should immediately wash their hands with soap and water after toileting or diaper change.

(d) Use hand sanitizer or hand-sanitizing wipes if liquid soap and warm running water are not available in accordance with paragraph (c) of this subsection. The staff shall wash the staff's hands as soon as practicable once liquid soap and warm running water are available.

#### Findings:

General: Based on observation, a staff member changed several children's diapers without washing her hands in between changes. The staff member did use hand sanitizer however, the regulation states that a staff member must wash their hands with liquid soap and warm running water before and after diapering each child.

General: Based on observation, the diaper pad in the two-year-old classroom had two tears, which exposed the padding and was no longer able to be properly sanitized. Also, in the infant and one-year-old rooms, the changing pad had an absorbent cover over the surface resulting in the pad not being able to be easily cleaned between children.
